Nominations for Club Officer positions need to be held in March with the Club Election of Officers to be held no later than 15 April 2014.

CabSec David will be forwarding the PU101 Club Office Reporting Form to Clubs by both email and snail-mail in late February and says that the reporting of newly elected club officers is extremely important as it ensures that the new officers receive information and material that they will need for the coming year.

March is Lions Membership Month

Continuous membership Growth is critical to the survival of Lions in Australia and the aim is to recruit an additional 649 new members across the nation due to our efforts of March Membership Month 2014.

It is proposed that March 2014 will be March Membership month with every club in every district asked and encouraged to conduct a minimum of one proactive recruitment campaign which will be supported by PR activity at all levels - National, District, Zone and Club, that will focus on and raise awareness of "Who are Lions and What we do" right across our Nation.

One of the key components is to get maximum PR exposure over the period to create awareness of "Who" the Lions are and "What" we do. We expect there will be an increase in the number of enquiries. "Enquiries" treated correctly become "Prospects," and a large percentage should be converted to new members which is our ultimate aim.

The "two hands" TV Ads will continue to run in support of Club and District initiatives.

Lions at all levels (DGs, Zonies, Club Presidents and others) are encouraged to contact their local radio outlets for "live" of prerecorded" interviews to promote their Club's initiative and Recruiting activities.

Clubs are requested to complete a minimum of one pro-active recruiting activity that will introduce new members to their clubs. This can range from shopping centre displays, free raffles, a ladies "High Tea" afternoon, recruiting in conjunction with existing activities eg Sausage Sizzles, "Bring a Friend" Club night or anything else you can think of.

Riverside Club says "Thanks for the Stamps"

The Riverside Lions Clubs aims to raise \$1000 from the sale of used stamps and to contribute this to the Lions Childrens Mobility Foundation.

The Riverside Club has acted as the collecting agent for all contributing clubs in Tasmania and says this project which takes up very little time and effort can be expanded if we all ask our family and friends and collect. on our behalf.

Other innovative ways of collecting can also be explored, perhaps by approaching schools in your area and involving the schoolchildren in

the project.

Lion Ian Main from the Riverside Lions Clubs says that all stamps collected are checked for quality and therefore command the highest prices at auction.

lan says "If you wish to help in the quality control, please follow these basic rules:

... if cutting off the excess paper, leave 3-4mm around the stamp - it is not necessary to soak the paper

... discard any stamp that is torn, has any of the perforations missing or is creased;

... discard any stamp that is heavily postmarked, particularly through the subject of the stamp eg a person's face - however, send higher face value stamps anyway because these may be sold separately as there are fewer of them in circulation:

... if in doubt, just include them and we will make a decision.

And don't worry if you haven't the time to cut off the excess paper, we will do that - it keeps us off the streets".

Measles Initiative major effort in 2014

The major effort of the Lions Clubs International Foundation this year is to continue the Lions Measles Initiative.

The challenge for Lions worldwide is to raise \$30 million b our centenary year 2017. Lions \$30 million will be matched dollar for dollar b the UK Department of International development or the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, giving a total of \$60 million in the fight against measles and rubella.

Bill Gates Snr, co-chair of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation said "We are grateful for the continued and generous commitment of Lions to improve the health of the world's poorest children. This partnership will help to urgently reach all children, no matter where they live, with the vaccines they need."

"Giving the measles vaccine to children is one of the simplest things to do to protect them from the disease and its dreadful consequences," said the Rt Hon Justine Greening MP, the UKs Secretary of State for International development, "The funds raised by Lions members and matched by the UK or the Bill & Melinda Gates

Foundation will mean that millions of children will have healthier and happier lives, able to better contribute to their communities."

Measles is a highly infectious and deadly disease, killing an estimated 430 people daily, according to the WHO by weakening the immune system, making young children vulnerable to pneumonia, blindness, diarrhoea, hearing loss and brain damage. We've had recent scares here in Australia where measles has been brought back from overseas by travelers.

But, measles can be prevented with a safe and inexpensive vaccine. The measles-rubella vaccine costs leas that \$1 per dose.

LCIF District Coordinator, PDG John Gillham says donations, all of which are eligible to go towards a Melvin Jones Fellowship or Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship, should be made to the *LCI/LCIF Lions Measles Initiative* and forwarded to the District's Cabinet Treasurer.
