Launceston - Windmill Hill Lions Club have a Food Van for Sale

This Van has been used by our club for many fundraising events over the years at major events such as 'Agfest'. This van has recently been serviced and all cooking appliances checked for compliance and safety. It is fitted out with two small refrigerators (Electric), two deep fryers with accessories and a large multi burner BBQ (all Gas powered) and an electrical Bain Marie system. The sides open up for customer service and inside is a preparation island and Bain Maries.

This Van is a Large Size – Approximately 2.4 Metres high (8 Feet) and also 2.4 Metres Wide (8 Feet) with a length of 7 Metres (22 feet). It is very suitable for semi-permanent siting and comfortably houses 5 cooks and service staff.

This large van is currently registered and in Roadworthy condition.

Note - This van is not suitable for towing by a standard 'family' car!

ULVERSTONE LIONS CLUB RODEO

A quiet drink and a bit of a chat led members of the Ulverstone Lions Club down a path they had never trod before. A proposition was put to a dinner meeting that the Club stage a rodeo, in union with the Preston Community Centre. Members present thought it would be good idea and The Royal Flying Doctor Service was nominated as the recipient of funds raised.

The Preston Community Centre is situated in the quiet little county town of Preston, 25mins south of Ulverstone. It hosts a football club, a cricket club, and provides an opportunity for local people to socialize and network.

March 26, 2022 was chosen as the date, and preparations began during the Covid pandemic. Many hoops had to be jumped through but the organizing committee bashed on, and gradually the event came together.

Weather on the day of the rodeo was absolutely fantastic. Preston turned it on, a beautiful autumn day with the sun beaming, no wind and that fresh clear mountain air. And a larger than expected crowd attended.

Over 90 percent of Club members and their wives/partners attended and worked very hard, manning the gate, parking cars, catering the VIP tent, selling alcohol tickets, organizing food vendors, looking after patrons.

Bull riders hit the dust, broncs bucked, and barrel racers hung on for dear life. The crowd cheered and at the end, the rodeo was deemed great success, and Russell Robertson serenaded the crowd well into the night.

Later in the year members of the Ulverstone Lions attended the annual Rodeo Dinner and were absolutely delighted to be awarded "The Rodeo of the Year" award by Island Rodeo Circuit, the governing body of all Tasmanian rodeos.

A Presentation Dinner was held for the raised funds to be presented to the RFDS, and after the Ulverstone Lions Club awarded further funds, together with funds raised by the annual street collection, the Club was in a position to donate \$20,000.

At a later Club dinner meeting the proposition was put that the rodeo be staged again, and the vote was unanimous. The Ulverstone Lions Club together in partnership with the Preston Community Centre will again stage the rodeo March 25, 2023 commencing at 2pm. Proceeds will again go to the Royal Flying Doctor Service.

The Preston Rodeo was held for a second year on March 25 2023 and once again a most successful event. The Ulverstone Lions Club were pleased to be able to donate the profit to the Royal Flying Doctors once again.




Following the performances, many audience members were keen to get photos of and with some of the performers, including the showgirls.


