Dear Lion,

You know that keeping your Lions family strong depends a great deal on inviting new members to join. But it may be even more important for clubs to hold onto those members after they become Lions.

Retaining members, new and old, takes effort but it is not complicated or difficult. Mostly, it requires paying attention to three common-sense ideas:

Welcome Involve Nurture

(It's no coincidence that, in English, these initials spell-out "WIN." They can make your club a winner!)

"Welcome" means making new members feel welcome and a part of the group. This begins with something as simple as saying "hello" and learning new members' names quickly. It also means listening respectfully to their ideas and needs. Ask yourself the questions and follow the tips in the <u>My</u> <u>Club, My Family Pocket Guide</u>. "I Believe" these simple steps can endure long-term success.

"Involve" means giving new members meaningful responsibilities from the very beginning. People become Lions because they want to take action. Members who feel that they are making a significant contribution are likely to stay. I encourage you to ask all members what they want to be involved with. Find out how your club's projects can match their skills and meet their needs.

"Nurture" includes leading by example but also means giving new members an effective orientation and involving them in the Lions Clubs International Mentoring Program. Support and encouragement from the Lions family is key during the development of new Lions members. Long term care and support keeps members involved and service ongoing. View the <u>My Club, My Family brochure</u> for program ideas for your Lions family.

I believe that you can use your final three months of leadership to finish with strong membership results. I believe you can do it!

Thank you for all you do for your fellow Lions, your community and the world.


With the Floods persisting in NSW and Victoria the Council Chairman has launched a National Appeal to all Clubs in our Multiple District for donations and Clubs are requested to send donations to Cabinet Treasurer Erik for on forwarding to the Foundation.

In the meantime the Foundation will provide immediate financial assistance from our Disaster Emergency Fund when requested to the relevant District Governors to enable them to assist families affected. So your Clubs donations would be greatly appreciated.

At the February Meeting of Trustees a further 21 Grants were approved totalling \$113.016 and only one Club in T1 received a Grant. An Emergency Grant was ratified for \$3500 to the Lions Club of Kingborough to assist a Blackmans Bay family who lost all their possessions when their home was partially destroyed by fire whilst they were away visiting family on the mainland.

It may be of interest to note for our Leo Clubs that an application was received from a School based Leo Club to assist with the purchase of Medical Equipment for a First Aid Station. This would be the first application received by the Foundation to assist a Leo Club. So Leo Clubs in Tasmania you too can apply to the Foundation for assistance with your projects.

The Trustees have also agreed to continue recognition of Lions who achieve 50 years service with the presentation of the 50yr Medallion and a copy of the autobiography of W.R."Bill" Tresise MBE, the Lion responsible for establishing Lions Clubs International in Australia. This information is extracted from the International Data Base. Copies of the book are available from me at the cost of \$35.00. The Books would make an ideal gift to Youth of the Year Judges, High School libraries or local Municipal Libraries. Profit from the sale of the autobiography will be presented to ALF.



All Clubs in our District have recently been circulated with information relating to the Foundation's Awards and the AGM which will be held during the Multiple District Convention in Perth WA in May. 

Daniel is to commence his training with Righteous Pups in Bendigo on March 20. Representatives from our Club will attend Daniel's graduation which will be celebrated with great relief. Following is a copy of a letter of thanks we received for publication within the district which supported our fundraising efforts.

To the Lions Club of Rocky Cape

On behalf of Daniel, our family wishes to very sincerely thank your amazing club, your generous sponsors and supporters for your assistance in raising funds in Daniel's name to purchase a Service Dog for him from Righteous Pups Australia.

We are also very grateful to the people of Burnie, Wynyard & district, some of whom knew Daniel personally and many who didn't, who kindly donated funds so as to help improve the overall quality of his life and help him overcome social barriers with the opportunity to develop a sense of connection to others and the world around him.

We hope you can appreciate that living with a child with autism & high levels of anxiety means that our family can be complex to manage and maintain.

A recent situation has arisen for us involving a significant medical concern affecting Daniel's primary carer - a major operation & stay in hospital is highly likely to be required and as Daniel suffers from severe separate anxiety, based on past experiences, the effect on him is likely to be detrimental. Therefore, we have taken steps to reduce this risk which has resulted in significant upheaval to our lives. This is due to the need for Daniel to be distracted by close family members during his carer's hospital stay.

As these family members reside outside of Tasmania and are too elderly to travel, we have found it necessary to relocate to be near them.

We are presently undergoing a waiting process that could be anywhere between 6-12 months, minimum. So, as to not disrupt the continuity of Daniel's education, he will remain homeschooled through distant education interstate.

As Daniel has recently undergone some major changes and finds these experiences very stressful, we feel it's in his best interests not to introduce any further ones this year.

We hope you understand that in our situation, we were left with little choice but to proceed in the direction have taken.



DISASTER FLOOD RELIEF vol 36

DG Toby writes: The Australian Lions Foundation has established an Appeal to support Districts impacted by the recent flooding throughout NSW and Victoria.

Please note the attached letter to all clubs from ALF, part of which follows in *italics*. I would like to thank those clubs who have already donated but I would be grateful for extra if clubs are able to give more. Also that donations already received will be pooled together with any other donation and split up between all districts effected by the floods.

Clubs are asked to make their cheques payable to your District and send it to your Cabinet Treasurer with a note that it is for the "ALF Disaster Fund". The District will accumulate the funds received and forward a District cheque to our Foundation.

If a club has a specific request where they would prefer their money to go then attach a note to their donation and Treasurer Erik will ensure it reaches the Club/District that they have asked for.

If your Club collects some donations from the public, for example by a "bucket collection", most people who donate do not request a tax receipt – they donate in the true Australian spirit of giving, which seeks nothing in return.

However if you do receive a request from a public or business donor, you must record the donor's Name, Address, and Amount Donated. When you send the Club's cheque to your District Treasurer, please also send a "tax deduction list" with all those details. This will be passed on to our Foundation and we will issue the appropriate receipts direct to the donor.

The funds provided by Lions will predominately be used to cover such areas as cleaning up, replacement of food, clothing, bedding, whitegoods, children's school requisites, toiletries, medications, and other specific areas of need.

When the current bad weather clears and the flood waters recede, the District Governors will be able to make a better assessment as to the needs of their affected areas and the Foundation will be able to fairly distribute the relief funds to the Lions Districts involved.

We greatly appreciate the efforts of the Clubs and the District Treasurers in following the above procedures. We will keep you advised as, together, we move forward in assisting the victims of these terrible disasters.
