201T1 District Christmas in July Advertising Campaign 2025

Dear Presidents and valued members,

As you probably know, our District has been running an advertising campaign with WIN Television (which now includes the Southern Cross Network) and on Facebook to increase Lions visibility across Tasmania.

After our successful 2024 Christmas cakes and puddings promotion, I'm writing to all clubs in our district to let you know about the next phase of our campaign - Christmas in July.

This is an opportunity for Clubs in the district to sell Christmas cakes in June and July; increase the visibility of Lions in the District; and raise community awareness of how our Clubs use funds raised.

Our plan is to release an edited version of the Christmas cakes and puddings ad for the month of June 2025. It will appear on Southern Cross and WIN streaming platforms and on Facebook community pages throughout Tasmania.

The ads will invite anyone who wants to purchase cakes and puddings for Christmas in July to order online through the Tasmanian Online Lions Club website. When someone places an order, it will be emailed directly to the Lions Club that they will select from a list of participating Clubs. When the Club receives the order, they will then organise payment and delivery or collection directly with the person or organisation who placed the order.

We hope that this campaign will have a number of benefits to Clubs in our District:

- It's an additional fundraising opportunity

- It will raise community awareness about the location of Lions Clubs across Tasmania and the causes that we support
- There will be communication with some community members for the first time. This could potentially lead to new members or a new friend of Lions or new fans of what we do.

Preparing for the Christmas in July campaign

1. We will assume that your Club would like to participate in this opportunity through this district campaign. If your club is not wanting to participate, please let me know by return email and we will not list your Club in the ordering process. We don't want to disappoint community members who place orders.
2. Clubs who participate in this opportunity will need to ensure that they have a supply of cakes and puddings - a box of puddings or two, a box of 1kg cakes and a box of 1.5kg cakes. It is envisaged that since this is a new idea the take up rate won't be crazy. Clubs can purchase cakes and puddings from Traditional Foods throughout the year by using the 2024 order form until the 2025 order form comes out in July.
3. Please ensure that your Club Secretary and Executive are open and readily prepared for a little more email traffic and to organise payments and deliveries or collection.

I will be keeping you updated on the progress of this campaign and would like to know by the end of March the Clubs who wish to take advantage of this opportunity and those who don't. Hopefully all clubs will be involved with the campaign. There will be updates in the district newsletters as well.

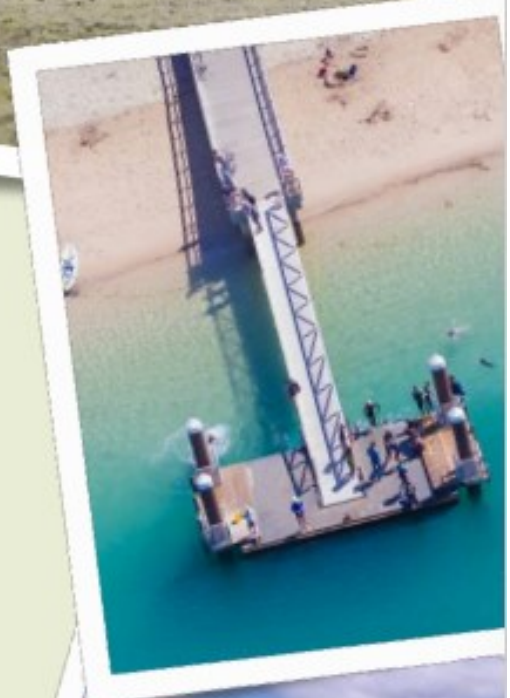

YOUTH OF THE YEAR CONTESTANTS EXCEL IN TCE FINAL RESULTS (ATAR)

The Lions "YOUTH OF THE YEAR" program has long been a chance for our very finest young people to demonstrate their public speaking and leadership skills to the wider community.

The recent release of the top ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank) scores for Tasmania shows that the top two scores were obtained by students who participated in the 2024 "Youth of the Year".

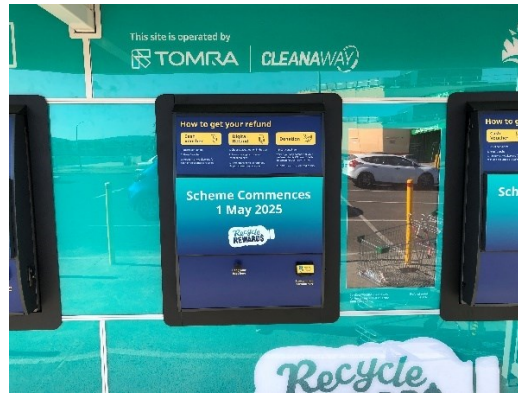

Although they will not be operational until 1st May 2025, the installation of Container Recycling Stations has already started with a Station now installed in the Target carpark next to the Woolworths / Mowbray Marketplace Shopping Centre located in Mowbray – a northern suburb of Launceston.

The unit consists of a Shipping Container like processing and storage area with four customer interface units (for receiving the containers). The units are currently covered with an operational date of 1st May 2025 printed on the covers.
