I thank those clubs have who have organized fundraising and donated through Treasurer Erik.

In our own district we have had sixty-six (66) flooded houses in Sheffield and Railton in the Kentish Lions Club's area and people in the Forth Valley have had isolation, flood damage to cropping land and destruction of farm fences.

Donations are needed throughout the disaster areas but the smaller regions become forgotten and we need to remember our local communities who support us.

At the end of January 201 T1 had donated \$41,600 for flood relief.

As Lion Dawn and I continue our visits around the Clubs, we continue to hear of the work being done with projects for children, Relay for Life, special projects for the disasters and work within the local communities.

GAINING NEW MEMBERS

The Standard Form Lions Club Constitution states that membership is by invitation and the new member is approved/accepted by a majority vote of the Board. Nowhere is it stated that a potential new member needs to attend a set number of dinner meetings or projects prior to joining.

If a member were to invite someone to join I would like to think that the club had sufficient respect and confidence in the judgement of the member to accept the prospective new member. I would presume the member had invited this person in good faith that they would make a good Lion and they had already been briefed on expectations, including financial commitment.

If a person shows interest through the web or other media we should be welcoming them to attend a meeting to meet with the other members and be prepared to inform them of what the club is involved in. They do need to be fully informed of the financial commitment as this is sometimes overlooked in the haste to acquire a new member

It is not compulsory that every member must order and pay for a meal when they attend dinner meetings. Some clubs have one dinner meeting per month and a supper meeting when the monthly Board meeting is held.

We need to remember that people join and stay for differing reasons and, due to circumstances, will remain for varying lengths of time. 100% attendance is no longer mandatory to remain a member. We do not need to attend every meeting if we are unable to, however we need to commit to contributing 100% when available.

We need to follow up on all leads; new members are not hammering on our door wanting to join, so why do we make it so hard?

We need to lead by example and welcome new people and new ideas. We need to be seen in our communities doing the things that need doing. Are we doing what we think our community wants or what it needs?

There is no definitive answer as to how or when to invite someone to join. We need to trust our members and not "challenge" possible new members introduced by them, let's respect our members and welcome new members.

One of our ethics is to encourage service-minded people to serve their community. We can sometimes be very judgemental of new people, too young, hair colour, clothing, etc. We do not want to drop the bar of the calibre of our members, but we do need to be understanding that lifestyles and expectations have changed and will continue to change.

Many families lost everything when a major earthquake struck Haiti one year ago. Thanks to Lions around the world, hundreds of these families are now moving into new homes.

Lions were among the first to offer help after the disaster, providing food, water and shelter. A year later, Lions around the world have donated more than US\$6.1 million to the LCIF Haiti Earthquake fund. And LCIF is using those funds to provide homes and hope - in Haiti.

Gail McFarlane explained Heartkids is Australia wide with sub branches in many area's, ours covers the North West area of Tasmania, which has seen a recent rise in babies born with Childhood Heart Disease (CHD), there are also branches in Launceston and Hobart.

We were aware that most of the interstate winners would not have had the opportunity of visiting Tasmania, and were keen to use the available time to show them some of Tasmania's special places. Lions were involved wherever possible, and we were very appreciative of the
