Fellow Lions Happy New Year to you all...

I hope you all had festive Christmas and are now rested and prepared to do what you do best...Serve our Communities.

I attended the Council of Governors meeting in Sydney this month and there were two items that will be of interest to you all, as follows...

Lions Clubs International have developed a completely new technology platform known as <u>Salesforce</u> and is one of the most recognised and accepted Customer Relationship Management platforms in the world, all data and so much more are going to be combined into one single data base.

Users will have the ability to access data from a single log in. In addition the system will provide a much more expansive online help and guidance without manuals etc.

It is currently being developed and tested by a number of users within LCI and Lions at large. It is proposed that the commencement of the new system will be July 2023.

The Council of Governors, the District Governors elect and the GAT Team

and members from the executive team attended a workshop, The Big Audacious Mission (Plan), facilitated by Dr. Joe Collins AO from the Long Range Development Committee.

#### So what is the Big Audacious Mission?

Well... It is increasing our membership in MD to 30,000members by 2030 and increasing the membership to 50,000 members by 2050.

Dr. Joe Collins facilitated a dynamic and exciting presentation and discussed the Multiple Districts membership decline of the last decade and I must say the statistics were very sobering to say the least. All participants worked on strategies that will turn our membership decline into positive growth.

We will be engaging with our GMA Team to develop the strategies that will assist to build stronger, bigger and more Clubs. All Clubs will have the full support of the GMA team who will be managing the Big Audacious Mission in each jurisdiction.



So, we need to get started and make a determined effort onwards to recruit members and build new Clubs. Our District T1 is showing signs of positive growth in some month then District has membership reduction in others hence a growth neutral situation. T1 is not alone there are nine other Districts in transition, this not good for Lionism in the MD, so we need to get moving and recruit as a priority.

To meet the agreed membership goals we will need to grow membership by one new member (nett) per Club and the District charter one new Club a year. I am optimistic with your support we can attain this goal(s) and move forward.

The MD Convention is being held on the Gold Coast on April 28th through to May 1st an innovative program has been put together Cont'd on page 2...

and there be excellent keynote speakers, I urge you to access the details on the web.

I am pleased to report that Club Development Day learning material and curriculum has been standardised and developed with resources for use in all Districts to prepare Club Officers with confidence and knowledge. An important part of the delivery is that all units will be delivered by trained presenters within the District or seek the services and help from the MD GAT Coordinators and team members.

A review of the training material has taken place and will align with current GAT expectations and the GMA. It is expected that all training materials will be forwarded to all Districts in February 2023.

On another note I must say I have been quite surprised of the negative feedback of Lions not practicing kindness and understanding to fellow Lions. This is disappointing and counterproductive to Club harmony and fellowship. I strongly suggest all Lions review the Lions Ethics and Purposes and reconsider that kindness matters.



### **National Disaster Appeal- Floods**

Dear Lions and Leos,

With the agreement of Council Chairperson Steve Boyce, we are now extending our National Disaster Appeal – Floods to include the Kimberley Region of Western Australia. Recent floods in this vast remote area of Western Australia has seen significant local impact.

Meanwhile we should also remember that Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria are currently in clean-up and recovery stages, after flooding throughout those areas, which began in March last year.

The Australian Lions Foundation will be there to support through our network of Lions Clubs on the ground.

#### LICF AUSTRALIA-ADOPT A FAMILY-FLOOD RELIEF INITIATIVE

All clubs have received an email from PIP Barry Palmer OA informing them of the Adopt a Family initiative regarding LCIF's response to widespread flooding across Australia, encouraging all Clubs to Donate \$1,000. ( or any amount they can manage), and how it will work.

As per the LCIF coordinators Zoom Meeting we were informed that due to LCIF constraints voucher will not be used but goods will be purchased directly.

LCIF will be working with ALF to make up shortfall to allow \$1,000 per household to flood victims. PIP Barry envisages funds required will be over \$2 million.

Up to December there were 1570 Families impacted by floods and now there are more including SA.

Already there has been 106 caravans allow catered, and more are needed ,for these families who are living on football ovals, paddocks and local parks and may not have homes for many years. As homes have been destroyed or need re building.

Our Australian Government and the State Governments are inviting applications for \$20,000 "Back to Home Grants" to assist with repairs.

Many families did not have flood insurance due to the cost.

#### The Criteria based on:

If the water entered the property from the sky before it hits the ground they are insured- If however the water entered the property after it hits the ground this is a flood water and because they do not have flood insurance their claim will be declined.

Several emergency LCIF grants up to \$10,000.00 have been approved to go towards recovery which includes clean-ups and infrastructure.


LCIF Australia will need to apply to LCIF for a "Major Catastrophe Grant".




Greetings, Lions and Leos!

## The Lions Leader

A series of Lions Policy and Procedure instructions and reminders for all Lions leaders from GLT Coordinator PDG Rob Mantach will feature each month.

There have been a number of articles, seminars, etc on how to make our clubs bigger and stronger.

Many club members are ageing and not able to perform the tasks that they 2) Meetings are efficient, once did many years ago. I have recently seen a couple of methods to attract new members and grow our clubs. The first is called the Ohio Plan as it was first devised by a club in Ohio.

The three pillars to grow your club are;

#### 1) Your club is prepared to grow

- Every member has a membership application.
- Every member has a service project list and a club brochure.
- Every member knows the process for joining.
- Every member knows how much it costs to join.
