

A district picnic at Ross March or April with a 20 over cricket match North against South is a possibility. We know that the best cricketers are in the South so we would go easy on those in the North.




What about more visitations, joint meetings and joint change-overs we need to re-vitalise some of the things we do?

Remember that our 75 Years Celebration runs until the end of June and April and May is not to late to plant 75 trees and shrubs to celebrate this important milestone.



It was thanks to the support of Canadian Lions – and the intervention of Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, that the first Lions club in London was founded in 1950.

Canadian Lions had provided invaluable support for children orphaned in the Second World War. To thank them, the then Queen sent her equerry Colonel Edward Wyndham (later Lord Leconfield) to Canada. He was so impressed that Windsor (Ontario) Lions Club agreed to sponsor the first London club, with Lord Leconfield as its founding Charter President.

Today, HRH The Countess of Wessex is a member of the Wokingham Lions Club and Royal Patron of the Lions Clubs of the British Isles. The support of the Countess has included carrying out the opening ceremony for the Lions shelter at the National Memorial Arboretum.



As a Lion, I believe in helping the less fortunate in the community (a basic Lionism tenet) and we all should pause to think about those in need this Christmas, and to assist those trying to help.

The Forth Valley Lions Club in Tasmania has made a donation of \$1000 to Gympie Medical Transport after hearing of the damage to its headquarters and disruption to services following the 2022 flooding in Gympie.

Gympie Lions Club President, Glenn Williams, said that his Club was contacted by the Forth Valley Lions seeking to help out a local community group that had been adversely affected by the recent floods.

A number of options were put forward but when the Forth Valley Lions heard of the good work that GMT does in the community and the damage to its facilities the decision was made to allocate the money to them.

GMT is run by a group of volunteers (the majority are drivers) who willingly give of their time, to ensure clients get to their medical appointments. Currently it has 750 clients with new clients registering daily and the six (6) cars have travelled over 350,000 klms.

GMT Secretary, Sally Carkeet said: "Gympie Medical Transport Committee is incredibly grateful for the \$1000 donation. We were all amazed at this donation coming from interstate and we invite your members when touring the mainland next, not to bypass Gympie but come into GMT, to say Hello and a have a cuppa".

Mr Williams made the presentation to GMT representatives on behalf of the Forth Valley Lions and thanked the Club for its thoughtfulness and generosity in considering Gympie as a recipient of the donation.

"It is another indication of how the Lions Clubs operate in support of one another and in support of their communities throughout Australia and rest of the world", he added.

The first Lions Diabetic Alert Dog was delivered free-of-charge by Australian Lions Hearing Dogs on the 17th of October in Adelaide, South Australia. For Eliza, receiving Sal was like two long lost friends finding one another.

'I've wanted a Diabetic Alert Dog ever since I first learnt about them. But I also knew it was an expensive process, plus getting the right dog from the right provider... well, I never thought about it too much further.



Diabetes is a very expensive illness to live with. While it has been

cheaper with the recent government subsidies, prior to this year, it probably costed me about seven grand a year just to live with diabetes. Adding the cost of training a dog, it was not sustainable, not on top of mortgage and everything else.

When I heard about the Lions Medical Alert Dog Program, well, I got in contact with Laura. And getting Sal has been great! She fits me so well. I just take her everywhere, it's almost like having a new baby! I get my little bag and off we go. Knowing that she isn't just a best friend but could also save my life... it's pretty astounding.

I think Sal has definitely bonded with me. I'm like her mum and she's like my daughter. Sal has actually picked up my hypos (low blood glucose levels) since day one. Our first week together she had alerted to four hypo events. This happened while I was cooking and while we were out at a café; she knew her priorities even with all the smells of food around her. Plus, I can imagine my hypos would smell very different from the samples she was trained with, so for her to pick it up and come straight to me was pretty amazing!'

Sal was delivered just in time for World Diabetes Day, which falls on the 14th November, and is the first of many Diabetic Alert Dogs to come.
