

relief efforts by donating generously to LCIF. As a result, we're mobilizing more than US\$15 million, which includes US\$8 million that Lions of Japan are raising.

LCIF has approved an initial US\$1.5 million grant to provide a special assistance fund for victims and to support Lions' operation centers. The remaining donations will assist with ongoing disaster relief and long-term rebuilding efforts.



During 2010 we had an increase in the number of schools entering the Peace Poster Competition. Sadly, all of the entries were from the North of the state from Latrobe through to Smithton.

This year I would like to challenge clubs south of Latrobe to consider taking part in this competition and to encourage those clubs who entered last year to once again support this Programme.

The cost is \$20.00 per kit, these are available on line, or I can order them for you. This is a great way of connecting with your school communities and a way of letting people know that we have many programmes for the youth.

Lions Regional Leadership Institute Newcastle 26th to 28th August 2011

Multiple District is organising and running a Regional Leadership Institute in Newcastle in August 2011. The Institute is open to all Lions and Lionesses who have not at that itime completed a term as President of a Club.

It focuses on building the skills of Lions members in preparation for leadership opportunities at the club level, particularly the positions of Club President and Vice Presidents.

The programme includes skills such as communications, member motivation, team building, running effective meetings, diversity of membership, public speaking, and knowledge about Lions programmes. The programme is organised and run by trained Lions from the Lions Clubs International Faculty.

The Institute is a live-in course and participants are required to attend all sessions over a three day period. There is a small registration fee of \$75 per participant and all accommodation and meals are included in this cost. Participants are required to cover their own transportation costs.

Clubs are encouraged to nominate members whom they feel will benefit from the programme, particularly identifying those members who are keen to take on leadership roles within their club.

- Dates: Friday 26th August to Sunday 28th August 2011.
- Venue: Hotel Novocastrian, Parnell Place, Newcastle, NSW.
- Accommodation will be twin share basis.
- Cost: \$75.00 includes accommodation and meals.
- Registration: Those wishing to enrol are required to complete an Enrolment Form and return to <u>PCC Keith Parry</u>, Institute Convener.

Any motion relating to a District Project must contain full organisational details of the project and the financial responsibilities of the Clubs within the District which decide to participate in the project, or where the details of a District Project are being amended, such motion must contain sufficient information to identify the effect of the amendment on the organisational details of the Project and the financial responsibilities of the participating Clubs.


Registration form will be on the website soon and in the August Newsletter.

Lions Club of Penguin


Wendy Brady reports on recent activities in Penguin raising money for the Queensland and Tasmanian flood appeals.

below).


Work was completed by midday, the weather was kind and staff provided a most enjoyable barbecue lunch and a tour of the Park for those who had not previously visited the Park.

This update was requested at the last Cabinet Meeting of 10-11

In Tasmania there are currently four "Devil Island Free Range Enclosures", FREs.

These are -

- Coast Natureworld, East Bicheno, 12ha, established in 2008
- Bridport, 22ha, established in 2010
- Freycinet, 22ha, established in 2011
- Tasmania Zoo, Riverside, 10ha under development.

The three established FREs all hold Insurance Population [IP] devils.

Tasmanian Lions have directly assisted in the construction of two of the FREs, Bicheno and Freycinet.

In addition to the Tasmanian FREs, an area was established at Barrington Tops in NSW in January 2011 to accommodate fifteen (15) IP devils and twenty (20) captive

---- bred devils from the Australian Reptile Park in Gosford, NSW.

SightFirst Awards Grants

US\$4.26 million was awarded during the May SightFirst Advisory Committee meeting. This includes grants: to China to support elimination of blinding trachoma, a nationwide low vision services project and a blindness prevention program; to India to construct and equip a Lions opthalmology clinic; to Kenya for refractive error services; to the Philippines for inclusive education for children with visual impairments.



Lions Club members also operate the gate for the footy club during home games and manned the kiosk during last year's grand final, so the regular kiosk operators could watch the final.


"In the off-season we offer support and help them run the kiosk they operate at the Latrobe speedway," Mr Freshney said.

MEET THE INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT FOR 2011-2012



Wing-Kun Tam (pictured above) became Lions Clubs International's 95th international president and its first from China. Born in Guangzhou, China, Tam was educated in Hong Kong where he began his international cargo company and raised his family.
