Perth Lions Club



Dedication of the "Horse and Ploughman" silhouette.

On Friday November 10, a small group assembled to celebrate the erection of a new silhouette just outside of Perth.

Lions clubs throughout the world share one key motto, "We Serve". They serve their communities – local, state, national and international.

With service in mind, during 2021 the local Lions club considered ways to contribute to the celebration of the 200th anniversary of the naming of "Perth", previously referred to as Punt Town.

Members wanted to provide a permanent memorial that would reflect the town's heritage. It was decided to erect a roadside silhouette of a horse and ploughman.

In officially dedicating the silhouette, Immediate Past President Carol Jones told the gathering that it acts as a reminder that the town has been a key part of the agricultural Norfolk Plains area since the early 1800s.

"We decided that the best position would be on Gibbet Hill, near the northern entrance to the town. A vast area, where agriculture remains vital to the local economy, can be seen from the hilltop."

"Determining the ownership of the Gibbet Hill land proved to be a little complex but co-operation between the Northern Midlands Council and the Tasmanian Department of State Growth enabled the project to proceed."

"The necessary approvals were received and the Council provided a generous grant. The Club donated \$4 500 to cover the remaining cost. Numerous individuals and organizations gave of their time and expertise, resulting in the marvelous structure that can now be seen and enjoyed."

Ms Jones named and thanked all who had supported the project.

Mayor Mary Knowles outlined much of the early history of the area that contributed to its heritage and thanked the Club for its fine efforts in producing such a fitting end product.

"The Council is always looking at ways of enhancing its towns. Working with members of local communities in ways such as this is key to producing amazing results."







What Does the Cabinet Treasurer Role Entail?

According to the Lions Clubs International District 201T1Inc

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS, the Cabinet Treasurer must:

- (1) Make reports to the cabinet as the district governor or cabinet may require.
- (2) Collect and receipt for all dues and taxes levied on members and clubs in the sub-district, deposit the same in such bank or banks as the district governor shall determine and disburse the same by order of the district governor.
- (3) Remit and pay over to the multiple district council treasurer the multiple district dues and taxes, if any, collected in the sub-district, and secure a proper receipt.
- (4) Keep accurate books and records of account, and minutes of all cabinet and sub-district meetings, and permit inspection of the same by the district governor, any cabinet member and any club (or any authorized agent of any of them) at any reasonable time for any proper purpose. Upon direction of the district governor or the cabinet, he/she shall furnish any such books and records as requested to any auditor appointed by the district governor.
- (5) Secure bond for the faithful performance of his/her duties in such sum and with such sureties as may be required by the district governor.
- (6) Deliver, in a timely manner, at the conclusion of his/her term in office, the general and/or financial accounts, funds and records of the district to his/her successor in office.
- (7) Perform such other functions and acts as may be required of each by directives of the International Board of Directors.

Christmas is only a few weeks away - has your Club placed an order for their Lions Christmas Cakes and puddings yet?

Order Discount Period finishes on 31 October 2023.

Orders must be delivered and paid for in order to receive the discount. The last date that you can place an order is **16 October 2023** to allow order processing and delivery before **31 October 2023**. There are no exceptions to this rule!

Damaged or Lost in Transit Products

If a product is damaged during transit, contact Dollar Sweets. You will need to provide details of the extent and type of damage and the quantity and type of goods affected. Dollar Sweets will lodge a complaint with the freight company on behalf of the relevant Lions Club. Photographic evidence of damaged goods may be requested so it is advised to hold onto any damaged goods until you have spoken to Dollar Sweets.

Goods lost in transit will only be replaced once confirmation has been received from the courier that the order is unrecoverable. Once confirmation has been received, replacement goods will be sent on the next available dispatch day.

Dollar Sweets must be notified as soon as possible of any damaged or lost in transit goods. Credits claims may be rejected if too much time has lapsed.


