This information needs to be recorded, because it forms part of our justification to the community, national governments and the United Nations (UN), that Lions Clubs should continue to exist to serve the community at the club, district, national, and international level. Lions is the only service organisation with a seat at the UN.

CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR 2020-2022

The Multiple District Convention to be held in Adelaide in 2020 will consider candidates for the office of International Director to represent Constitutional Area 7 for the term 2020 -2022. Intending candidates should refer to clauses 85-93 of the Multiple District Constitution and By-Laws.

In particular please note:

85. Subject to the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws, any member of a Lions Club seeking the endorsement of the Conventions of his/her District and of the Multiple District as a candidate for the office of International Director and/or International Second Vice-President shall:-

85.1 Deliver (by mail or in person) written Notice of Intention to seek such endorsement to the Cabinet Secretary of such District (in the case of a proposed District Convention endorsement) and to the Executive Officer (in the case of a proposed Multiple District Convention endorsement) no less than 60 days prior to the convening date of the relevant Convention at which such question of endorsement is to be considered.

85.2 Deliver with the said Notice of Intention evidence of fulfilment of qualifications for such office as set forth in the International Constitution and By-Laws.

Dear fellow lions of 201T1,

As this is my last offering as your District Chairman I must say a big thankyou to PDG Michael MacLaren for asking me to take on the role during his year as District Governor and all subsequent Governors since.

To DG Vere's cabinet, you did make the correct decision to allow my successor to sit in as an observer at the LEHP National Committee meeting in February this year. It has allowed him to get an insight as to the machinations of this Lions project and understand the hopes and aspirations of it. I wish Stephen Smith all the best, may he enjoy his term/s as District Chairperson. While this decision was not according to the unwritten rules it was seen as a positive move and now there is a precedent in place, for others to follow. A seamless transfer now in place.

At long last the wait for something to happen, has happened. The long awaited granting of an application to LCIF has been ratified for US\$75,000.00 which in round figures is AU\$125,000.00. This now allows LEHP Australia to purchase **20 Spot vision Cameras, one for each District plus a spare** if and when required. There will be conditions put in place, but Stephen will be able to pass them on when they become available.

In the meant time interested persons have been invited to a meeting in Somerset to discuss the expected initial training of operators who will kick off the Tasmanian project at St Bridgets Private School in Wynyard. This no doubt will be followed up with approaches to other Private schools firstly in the region, then as each region finds, and trains operators, plus entry to schools, then in time we will see entry, hopefully to the state education system.

Having said that, let us not forget the community at large. The same service will be available to them, all we need is the opportunity. It crossed my mind that the Leo Club members who are above the age of eighteen and are suitably credentialed and prepared to abide by the set code of behaviour may nominate for training. There is only one Lioness Club in this district at Rosebery. Ladies you may care to look at this as a project on the West Coast.

No barking up the wrong tree for these helpful pooches.....

At our recent board meeting donation letters were discussed as response to our last request was poor. I know Clubs do not donate to Lions Projects at every request but I would like to point out that **ALL donated funds to Hearing Dogs are used to train dogs.** I am available to speak at Clubs if there are questions about our project inhibiting donating.

It is expected to deliver 25 trained dogs this year, each trained dog costs about \$35 000. By the end of April it is expected that **dog number 590**, **since 1980**, will be delivered. Not bad in our 39 years and dogs are free to recipients. Also during April a dog was delivered to a gentleman in Lindisfarne. This is another dog sponsored by the Clarence Club. Ziggy was a hit with his new owner.

With the introduction of the puppy program we are streamlining the training and ensuring we have enough quality dogs to meet demand. As it will also shorten the training time in future more dogs will be put into service each year.

At our meeting it was also mentioned that there is a shortage of dog food in drought areas where fodder is being delivered especially in western NSW. Anyone with ideas how to help let me know and I will pass on to our CEO in SA.

This forum was attended by Lions and various community groups including The Salvation Army, Friends of Timor-Leste, Anola and other community groups.



Professor Clare Hanlon from the Institute of Health and Sport, Victoria University, was a key note speaker. Shas developed a framework for women in sport, women's needs and is the Director of Gymnastics Australia.

Why have women as leaders?

There should be 3+ women on a committee and if there is an all women group there should be 3+ men. Women have different experiences, different perspectives, knowledge and connections.

- **1.** The journey to become leaders visibility of girls and women 'if can't see it can't be' (86% of women aspire to be leaders as well if they see others in that role)
- Opportunities for children eg if a head prefect or captain of a sports team etc more than likely to be a leader later in life – have identity, a part of something
- How do we make women more visible at Lions Australia eg horse racing has more media profile than women in sport!
- Leaders create a pathway for others
- Continue the journey with confidence, resilience
- <u>2. Creating opportunities</u> networks, mentors and sponsors who you know, what you know, who knows what you know (sponsors are more effective)
- Lack confidence fear of failure
- Failure makes us stronger next time
- Women don't apply for leadership unless encouraged
- Concerted, consistent, continuous and collective action to move women forward



- 3. <u>Practical Advice</u> for women aspiring to be leaders
- Take the plunge and have faith in yourself
- Be authentic be yourself
- Don't be so hard on yourself
- Find your passion
- Focus on goals you want to achieve
- Gain mentors and sponsors
- Create a network of inspiring people around you
- Promote your achievements with mentors, networks and president
- Take the lead in your club
