

I will start this Newsletter with a late Seasons Greetings, I trust that the Festive Season treated everyone well and has led us to a Healthy and Prosperous New Year.

The Emergency Medical Information Book has been purchased to the tune of 23,965 items as at the end of December, once again Lions Clubs have

been major contributors to that outcome by ordering 8,800 books, 800 Pocket Editions and 48 Counter top Boxes. We continue to receive great suport from Local Govt, Health Depts etc with their figure of 11,390 books and Rotary Clubs have purchased the remainder.

The book has undergone an update as reported in the last Newsletter and will now be distributed across Australia in the one colour, that being predominately green with the Emergency Medical Information Book in bold red. Please be assured that the contents are not altered and there is no need to update/change existing books. If you have stock, please continue to distribute them and your next order will be the new design. The upshot of this new design coupled with the name change of the project to include Lions is that our advertising material is also under review and will be updated to reflect the new design shortly.

The project was successful last year to the extent of exceeding 50,000 books for the financial year, we can add to that numerous Pocker Editions and Counter Boxes. It would appear that we are on track to meet that sort of figure again this year and I am sure that with your continued support that we may even exceed that result. I look forward to the next six months.

Cancer Council Tasmania would like to recognise and thank the amazing contribution the Lions Clubs across Tasmania support our biggest fundraising event for the year, Relay For Life.

"2024 will be the 24th year that Relay For Life has taken place in Tasmania," Cancer Council Tasmania CEO Alison Lai said.

"Relay For Life brings communities together to celebrate Survivors and recognise the unsung heroes their Carers. We extend a special invitation to anyone who has survived cancer, experiencing a cancer journey or have cared for someone with cancer to join us (free of charge) for the opening lap. This is then followed by a special afternoon tea.

"We honour those we've lost during our candlelight ceremony, and we continue to raise funds to support people affected by cancer, fund research and prevention programs.

"Teams complete laps around a track throughout Relay For Life to signify that every day we're making strides towards a cancer-free future."

"This season we have six Relay For Life events across the State in February to April 2024. Our goal is to have more than 3500 participants and raise \$800,000.

"Every dollar raised at Relay For Life, the same as every other Cancer Council Tasmania fund-raising event, stays in Tasmania.

"Those funds go to support our prevention and support programs Statewide."

The Relay For Life 2024 program includes:

- Huon Valley February 17; 1-10pm
- Hobart February 24-25
- Circular Head March 2; 10am-10pm
- Launceston March 16-17
- Penguin March 23-24
- Triabunna April 6; 9am-9pm

People can register for or donate to Relay For Life at realyforlife.org.au.

It is also possible for regional communities to host their very own Relay, as Cancer Council Tasmania embrace a volunteer-led, staff supported model for Relay For Life. A great example of this in practice is the events held in Longford (November 2022) and in Triabunna (March 2023) for the first time. Events are flexible to be held whenever suits the community and embracing the length of the event that the community so-wishes.

Aurora Disability Services, is a unique registered charity providing services, care and support to adults with intellectual, physical, sensory and psychiatric disabilities and essential respite for families and carers.

Aurora used the bus to collect their clients from around Hobart and bring them to their facility where they learn skills, socialise and get the vital support they need everyday.

Clarence with support from the Tasmanian Lions Foundation and the Australian Lion Foundation contributed \$30,000 towards the purchase and fitting of a brand new bus. Aurora Disability Services were extremely grateful for Lions support, as their own fundraising efforts were struggling to fund the new bus.

supplies and cooks a barbecue for all students and staff of the town's school. In 2023 we needed to provide 360 sausages to feed the

hungry horde – quite a tall order.

Club Support Lion was invited to

attend and what a wise decision this proved to be.

James Redgrave proved to be an

experienced and excellent cook. He soon developed his own system that efficiently produced perfectly cooked sausages that were enjoyed by all.

All Lions were impressed with the ways in which the recipients expressed their gratitude and interacted with their hosts.

This continues to be a most worthwhile enjoyable annual project.

What Does the Cabinet Treasurer Role Entail?

According to the Lions Clubs International District 201T1Inc

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS, the Cabinet Treasurer must:

- (1) Make reports to the cabinet as the district governor or cabinet may require.
- (2) Collect and receipt for all dues and taxes levied on members and clubs in the sub-district, deposit the same in such bank or banks as the district governor shall determine and disburse the same by order of the district governor.
- (3) Remit and pay over to the multiple district council treasurer the multiple district dues and taxes, if any, collected in the sub-district, and secure a proper receipt.
- (4) Keep accurate books and records of account, and minutes of all cabinet and sub-district meetings, and permit inspection of the same by the district governor, any cabinet member and any club (or any authorized agent of any of them) at any reasonable time for any proper purpose. Upon direction of the district governor or the cabinet, he/she shall furnish any such books and records as requested to any auditor appointed by the district governor.
- (5) Secure bond for the faithful performance of his/her duties in such sum and with such sureties as may be required by the district governor.
- (6) Deliver, in a timely manner, at the conclusion of his/her term in office, the general and/or financial accounts, funds and records of the district to his/her successor in office.
- (7) Perform such other functions and acts as may be required of each by directives of the International Board of Directors.

POTENTIAL NEW MEMBERS THROUGH TV ADVERTISING

Your District is in the process of producing a series of Television adverts with a view to attracting new members. This campaign will show Ads in each area of Tasmania via the WIN network, starting around the 9th December. At this stage, this is wholly funded by the District.

This campaign is going to begin with a Media Release which will direct any interested public to a specific Website - made up of 3 pages. Page 1 will be a Landing Page; Page 2 – Membership Page, and Page 3 – Donation Page.

Membership enquiries will be directed to a District representative within 48hrs. The potential member will be interviewed and the best Club option will be discussed, taking into account what they're interested in supporting. The appropriate Clubs' membership Chair and President will be notified, and Clubs are requested to make contact with that potential member within 48hrs.

If you're lucky enough to receive a new member out of this process, please LISTEN to them, HEAR what they want in Lions, SPONSOR them through their early membership days, and ACTIVELY sort out your members so that CONFLICT is minimised both within the club and especially in the public eye. Most new members nowadays are well educated, have their own views, do not want to be micro-managed, have certain interests, and will not put up with Club CONFLICT.

Historically, many recruits in the past have resigned from Lions within around 2 years – for a variety of reasons. While conflict has been the cause in some cases, in many cases, it's because Clubs have not been willing to listen to their members.

Please take the time to understand your new members needs and strongly support them.
