# Lions Respond

Lions have responded positively to the disaster response that followed the devastating bushfires that ravaged many parts of Tasmani in early January.

District Governor David has launched the Tasmanian Lions Bushfire Appeal and has set up the Tasmanian Lions Bushfire Disaster Response Group.

PDG Ken Gatehouse, the Distict Disaster Relief/Lions Alert Chairman will lead the Response Group.

There was an immediate response to the appeal for donations from the Lions Clubs International Foundation, the Australian Lions Foundation, the Tasmanian Lions Foundation and from our own District emergency funds.

Clubs from throughout the State and from the mainland have contributed to the Appeal and directly to the Lions Club of Sorell

Lions Clubs have organised many fund-raisers and have assisted community groups in their fundraising efforts.

As has been reported to Clubs, after the initial response to assist at Emergency Recovery Centres, Lions in the south of the State have taken on the role of catering for the many volunteers restoring rural fencing and are well on the way to providing a community laundry/shower/toilet facility in Dunalley.

In the days following the fires on the Tasman Peninsula, International 1st VP Barry Palmer and Council Chairman Lou Onley visited Tasmania and the fire-ravaged areas and provided valuable assistance to the Lions disaster response.
