Lions support Inclusion Table Tennis

Deloraine Table Tennis League has been running weekly table tennis competitions in Meander Valley for nearly 30 years. We run an evening social roster competition on Wednesday (7-9 pm) and lunchtime tournaments at Deloraine High School.

Beginning in August 2021, Deloraine Table Tennis League partnered with **Delgunyah Disability Services** to trial a new weekly inclusion table tennis program. The program has been very successful, with up to 30 players each week. Most of the players are young people living with a disability and their carers/family/friends, but the inclusion group also includes a cross-section of the community; Primary and High school students and their families, club members, and people just wanting to try table tennis. **This is the mix we were hoping for. Inclusion table tennis is all about using the sport to break down barriers and promote connection, belonging and selfdevelopment.**

Sarah Grima, mother of inclusion table tennis player Hayden Grima, says "table tennis is the only activity that my son will happily leave the house for. It provides a safe place, free from judgement, where he can belong to a club, meet new people and learn new skills. We are so grateful for this group – it means the world to us to see him enjoy an activity where he is really included and valued."

Deloraine Lions Club have been a major supporter of the inclusion table tennis program. In 2021, Deloraine Lions Club donated \$450 for quality bats and balls for 15 inclusion players. For 2022, Deloraine Lions Club are donating \$1000 to pay for insurance (through club memberships) for up to 33 inclusion players.

Deloraine Table Tennis League would like to express its heartfelt thanks to the Lions of Deloraine for their incredible support for the inclusion table tennis program.

In 2022, we have big plans for the inclusion table tennis program. Through Table Tennis Australia, we have applied for a Federal Government Grant to enrol a young person living with a disability into a two-year school-based apprenticeship to become a Certificate II Sporting Organisation Officer. Training will be provided through Deloraine High School's Trade Training Centre. The cadet's on-the-job training component will be to learn to run the Inclusion table tennis program, alongside a support mentor (a Deloraine Table Tennis League member) also funded through the project. Children's Vision Screening Program

We need trained operators!

In Tasmania we have now screened over three hundred and fifty (350) children, from Smithton to Clarence. Seventy-seven (77) children have been referred for testing.

We only have three teams of vision screeners and we need more.

We also need a second screening kit, cost around \$10,000. and grant options are being investigated. Planning is underway for training to take place in February in the North West Coast region. If your club is interested in LEHP and vision screening then, please contact me.

There could be as many as two thousand (2000) children across Tassie who at the moment struggle in the classroom. We can make a difference.

One project covers both Vision and Youth Global causes.

The costs involved for a Club to become a Participating Club are minimal, only a \$4.00



per member voluntary donation to LEHP. This gives your club access to LEHP promotional material. <u>The need for more clubs</u> <u>and Lions to become involved in LEHP and vision screening is</u> real.

I am willing to travel to your club to explain more and train your members.







Please be advised that applications must be received as soon as possible to attend this locally coordinated Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI) training course being held in Launceston, Grindelwald from 18-20th February 2022.

This training is for Lions with none or limited experience in Leadership roles, and I encourage all Lions to consider participating. The Institute is facilitated on an annual basis in MD 201 and will rotate around the Australian States. This Lion's year we are strongly promoting this Institute in Tasmania (T1). Other MD participants will also be attending.



It is important that Tasmanian "T1" Lions participate, and are in the majority of those attending. The expectation is that fifty (50) participants will be registered, so please give this this your urgent consideration to participate. You will not be disappointed!

The cost to participate in the RLLI is \$150, which covers accommodation, catering and training materials and excellent facilitators. I am confident your Club (if approached) will give consideration to cover your costs.

All applications must be received as soon as possible. The Application Form is on the following pages.

I cannot reiterate enough that this is a coupe for T1 to host RLLI, and we need to make it a success so that consideration of further training in T1 will be considered by the National Office and LCI.

PARTICIPANT QUALIFICATIONS

Candidates must be Lions or Leos in good standing from clubs in 201.

Preference will be given to Lion candidates have not completed a year as club President. (This restriction does not apply for Leo's).

As this is a live-in programme Leo's must be 18 years or older.

Candidates will be required to commit to all days of the institute, including group mealtimes. <u>Attendance at all classroom</u> sessions and scheduled meals is mandatory.

COST OF THE INSTITUTE

Lions MD201 will provide all meals and lodgings on a twin share basis for the duration of the institute. If additional accommodation days are required this would be at the cost of the participant. Travel costs are the responsibility of the participant.

On acceptance each participant will be required to pay a non-refundable fee of \$150. Please do not send funds until you receive a notification of acceptance into the institute.

SELECTION PROCESS

Because of the high number of applicants received for such programmes, acceptance into the institute is not guaranteed. Selection will be made by the MD201 Global Leadership team in consultation with each district GLT Coordinator. Depending on applicants received, a number of positions will be reserved for younger Lions and Leo applicants as part of the MD commitment to supporting youth leadership development. After the application submission deadline, all applicants will be notified of their selection status.

MD201 reserves the right to cancel the institute due to insufficient applications or other circumstances. In such event any fees paid will be refunded.




