Establishing your identity on MyLCI The amount of information that needs to be provided by users of MyLCI, when they first register their user name and password has been extended from just quoting one's membership number, to also including the first line of your address (in MyLCI) and the full name of your club, including whether it is a Lions, Leo or Lioness club. It is important that you ask your club secretary to update contact details whenever they change.

A proposal will only be considered if the submitting Club is prepared to commit itself financially to the project.

At the conclusion of a project when a Foundation Grant has been made, a detailed report of funds expended, publicity material , and photographs are to be supplied to the Foundation. An Acquittal/Accountability Grant pro forma will be available on the web site (currently under development). Now available from the TLF Secretary.

All Grant Applications must be submitted to the Foundation Secretary at least 10 days prior to a Foundation scheduled meeting to allow adequate time for the Directors to consider the Grant Application.

Directors of the Foundation are available as speakers at Club dinner meetings to report on the Foundation and its activities.

Progress Report

Nationally the response to Campain 100 has been

less than spectacular. As a consequence the MD target for 2018-19 has been reduced. This now brings the 201T1 target from the initial US\$50,700 to US\$15,870. As of 31 Jan, 13 Clubs have made donations to LCIF totalling US\$5,475. We still have a long way to go to reach the revised target for the year.

Traditionally in our District donations have been made by Clubs and only occasionally by individual Lions and then in most cases through their Club. It should be noted that when individual donations are made either in their own name or through their Club, the donation is credited to the Club for the purpose of the annual requirement for Club Excellence Awards. Clubs are reminded that for recognition for a Club Excellence Award donations need to be received and banked by the Cabinet Treasurer before the end of May.

The "Eyes " Have It...Or Do They?

Dear fellow Lions,

A short report this quarter. I attended the District Convention at Devonport and set up a stand promoting Lions Eye Health issues and with assistance from Lion Boof Harper managed to keep it manned as being a Director of the TLF Saturday lunch period was a write off.

Unfortunately, we didn't seem to be able to compete with other higher profile exhibits, but we keep trying. Many of the LEHP Ambassadors that attended sadly seemed to be involved with other varied programs.

Lastly, my focus has been to try and get funding for at least one Spot Vision camera and associated equipment which at the time of writing has been decided by Tasmanian Lions Foundation, (3-2-2019) leaving only the Australian Lions Foundation being left to support the grant application for a sum of \$3600.00 each.





On behalf of the Penguin, Kentish and Wynyard Lions clubs, I wish to thank the *Tasmanian Lions Foundation* for acceptance of the application. All that remains now is for the *Australian Lions Foundation* to action that grant application in the near future.

I have been a director of the TLF for fourteen years and have never seen so much support paper work requested for such a small sum of money ever, but at the end of the day.

The building of a team of Vision Camera Operators to be trained is in hand in the North-West, A new Ambassador has been nominated to replace PDG Michael MacLaren, he is Lion Tony Bedelph who has done the Online Training modules and now only needs the hands on training module to be fully certified with myself.

Lion Anne Fagg OAM, has now also completed the full online theory course for the use of the Spot Vision testing equipment and will now only have the practical to complete which will give us three fully trained operator/ supervisors. Lion Anne can now start negotiating with an independent primary school to carry out training and testing of preschool and primary school pupils. Dependant on where the maximum number of people who wish to become operator come from will determine where we conduct the practical training module.

LEHP Figures are now in hand for this Lions year for funding of the Lions Eye Health Program for all districts. 18 Clubs in our district donated per levy/donation a total of \$3852.00, leaving 32 clubs who choose not to support a Sight related program. Something my successor can build on.

"Anna's Quest" Bound For The Phillipines

With permission of District Governor Vere Cooper

To President and members Lions Clubs of Tasmania

Through my son Rick (ex-lion) I am associated with a group of people who are working to put together a ship load of supplies to take to the Philippines to benefit children in need, with school books, clothes and medical supplies etc.

The project was undertaken by a friend's wife (Filipino) as a humanitarian project.

The small ship was given to the group to start the project moving by Tas Ports.

Malcolm and Anna McDougall and their project are in the middle of a quandary!

Project Philippines Australia Inc., a not for profit organisation has been fighting for the last 5 years

The old 40 metre Fishing Trawler CORVINA was offered to the pair back in 2013 for a \$1, the Port just wanted it to be gone!

Renamed, the vessel "ANNA'S QUEST" once completed is capable of being able to carry 170 tons of stores, 40 cubic metres of freezer space, 70,000 litres of fuel, 370kw of power and room for livestock and even a workshop. They would be helping the people of the Philippines and other Non-Government Organizations (NGO), alike. It could even be used for emergency accommodation and possibly as a temporary hospital.



The Goal

To have the Vessel ready to sail by mid-March 2019 to enable them to get to the Philippines before the Cyclone season, this will be the third time they have tried!

Strengths

Through the tireless efforts of many volunteers and sponsors a lot of the work has already been done, some \$380,000 worth of man hours, the Vessel has had a lot of work started to get her sea ready and the collection of very needy supplies nearly complete, many tons of bedding, hospital beds, medical equipment, children's clothes, toys etc.

Weaknesses

Financial assistance is required to get the project over that last hurdle and satisfy the powers to be, last slipping, bridge electronic equipment, fuel, insurance etc. to the tune of \$153,000. All these things have ultimately become the problem, you know the chicken before the egg, we won't let you go unless you have these things in place etc.!

The TV programme Australian Story wants to do a story on the voyage, just imagine the coverage this could have all over Australia for Lions International and to Lions of T1

Australian Story

My Son Rick (who is third Officer of the Ship) is writing a

business plan for this venture and has suggested to me that I contact the Lions of the Philippines and tell them what we are doing.

Part of this grand plan to help those in need around the Cebu area is to deliver a boat, renamed very aptly "ANNA'S QUEST", and sail it to the Philippines and among other things, using it as a maritime trainee ship. The ship will be used to deliver aid and give valuable skills to locals. Upon delivery it will be completely re-furbished by Regency marine in Cebu and managed by them under Anna and Project Philippines Australia supervision.

I have arranged in consultation with the master of the vessel that for any Lions aid he will fly the Lions flag at all ports of call

It has been suggested that if every club in T1 was to donate as little as \$2,000 each this would be enough to float the project and enable them to leave on time, of course if a club wishes to donate more then so be it.

The easiest way to make a donation is to deposit it into the Project Philippines Australia bank below and to let me know when and how much so I can keep a tally, all contributions will be acknowledged.


