Fellow Lions





TREE PLANTING CHALLENGE

Lions find it impossible to resist a challenge. The goal of planting <u>one</u> <u>million trees</u> in a single year was surpassed September 7th.

Of course, the challenge is not really the important part. It's furthering Lions mission to be good stewards of the environment that matters most. Planting trees helps prevent soil erosion, cool the environment and replenish the oxygen in the atmosphere.

In Sri Lanka, the Colombo Maitland Lions Club planted 200 banana trees which provide all these benefits and provide a source of income for the local people.

In Zambia, the Lusaka Mulungushi Lions Club planted 60 fruit and shade trees at a new school for orphans and impoverished children. The trees will provide a nutritional supplement and create an appropriate learning environment for the school's 375 students.



Lionsonoz Knitting Project Moves Forward

The Lionsonoz knitting coordinator Lion Betty-Anne White has been overwhelmed by the response to the appeal through the "Lion" and the District Newsletters for knitted articles. She said that not only are we receiving knitted garments and toys from our own members but we are regularly receiving parcels posted from all over Australia to assist in the cause of providing warm garments to those in need of them.



She said that we primarily look for articles to help young children in need during the colder periods but we have been also able to provide larger sizes to assist needy youth as well.

Recently we sent 2 large parcels of beanies and jumpers to Father Riley to assist him in his Youth Off the Streets program where he assists homeless teenagers.

When the outlet to the Orphanages in Southern Africa was closed last year, we looked for areas closer to home that needed these garments. Knitted beanies and other children's size garments and knitted toys have been given to Ronald McDonald house for use of children caught up in the trauma of an accident to them or members of their families when they find themselves in a hostel environment away from their homes. We also have been able to provide knitted garments to various aboriginal communities in the Australian outback missions through members of BCA.

She said that we have also been able to provide garments, mostly beanies to Camp Quality via Cancer Council assistance network. She added that she recently received a huge parcel of beanies, rugs, jumpers and toys from a small Lions Club at Surat Qld with the following letter:

We are a tiny Lions club in the Bush. Our Community has just experienced a bad 8 year drought immediately followed by two record floods events over the last year. These terrible events affected our Community greatly but like all small communities, the kindness of Community Spirit shines as a beacon to help others, not only locally here in Australia, but wherever such help is needed. Some of our Lions and their mates have put the enclosed


parcel of knitted garments together for the great cause that you have promoted. We hope this small contribution helps.

Another Lionsonoz project is the receiving and distribution of used postage stamps. A box containing over 2 kilograms of trimmed used postage stamps was received from the Penrith Lions Club which together with over 3 kilograms of stamps received from various Lions Clubs and local donors will be sent off to the South West Rocks Lions Club to be processed and sold to provide funds to assist the Lions Children's Mobility Project.

Healing Miracle for Burns

A young man sprinkling his lawn and bushes with pesticide wanted to check the contents of the barrel to see how much pesticide remained in it. He raised the cover and lit his lighter and the vapors inflamed and engulfed him.

He jumped back screaming. His neighbor came out of her house with a dozen eggs yelling: "bring me some eggs!" She broke them separating the

whites from the yolks. Another woman came to her aid & helped her to apply the whites of the egg to the

young man's face. When the ambulance arrived and when the EMTs saw the young man they asked

who had treated him. Everyone pointed to the lady in charge. They congratulated her and said: "You have saved his face." By the end of the summer the young man brought the lady a bouquet of roses to thank her.

His face was like a baby's skin. Keep in mind this treatment of burns

which is included in teaching beginner firemen this method. First aid consists of spraving cold water to

the affected area until the heat is reduced and stops burning the layers of skin. Then spread egg white on the affected area.

One woman burned a large part of her hand with boiling water. In spite of the pain she ran cold water on her hand separated 2 egg whites from the yolks beat them lightly and dipped her hand into the bowl. The whites then dried and formed a protective layer. She later learned that the egg white is a natural collagen. She continued to apply layer upon layer of beaten egg white for at least one hour. By the afternoon she no longer felt any pain and the next day there was hardly a

trace of the burn. 10 days later no trace was left at all and her skin had regained its normal color. The burned area was totally regenerated thanks to

the collagen in the egg whites. This information could be helpful to everyone.

Please pass it on.


Engaging Our Youth



During October in particular, Lions around the world lead the fight against blindness. They raise awareness of the importance of World Sight Day, recognized each October. Thev organize projects throughout the month to make a difference in their communities ... by helping those who live with blindness and visual impairment.

They are fulfilling the appeal made to Lions by Helen Keller almost 90 years ago to be Knights of the Blind. It is therefore appropriate that we remind ourselves of that challenge

Dear Club Treasurer's

Whilst I am pleased to report that the vast majority of you are paying your dues promptly, and I thank you for that, there are unfortunately also a few who are of the firm belief that accounts should not be paid until you receive the final demand in either blue or red.

To those, I suggest that you familiarize yourselves with the International policy on late payment of dues, which in short states, " A club with more than US\$20.00 outstanding after 120 days will be placed in Status quo".

As club treasurer, you will receive a monthly invoice from USA, on which, the amount will vary according to the exchange rate at the end of the month. So, when you pay the account, always use the latest statement, even if the amount is slightly higher, if you don't, all you achieve is these small annoying balances.

On the other side, I am also receiving a number of cheques with relative small amounts from clubs which have a credit balance with International. Please note that if there is a "minus sign" after the amount on your statement, this means that your account is in credit to this amount and that no payment is required.

And finally, Please don't send any cheques to USA, All you achieve is, in the worst case, the cheque is lost, and in the best case, there is a substantial delay in crediting the amount to your account, as USA normally returns the cheque to me for banking locally.

In order for your account to be credited with your payment in the current month, I must bank the cheque and email USA a copy of the banking advise by the 28th day of the month.

So there you have it, it is relatively easy, but I do encourage you to take advantage of the incoming officer training that is conducted in each region prior to July 1st. and if in doubt, give me a ring or send me an email or fax.

Picture yourself stumbling and groping at noonday as in the night; your work, your independence, gone. In that dark world wouldn't you be glad if a friend took you by the hand and said, "Come with me and I will teach you how to do some of the things you used to do when you could see?" That is just the kind of friend the American Foundation is going to be to all the blind in this country if seeing people will give it the support it must have.

You have heard how through a little word dropped from the fingers of another, a ray of light from another soul touched the darkness of my mind and I found myself, found the world, found God. It is because my teacher learned about me and broke through the dark, silent imprisonment which held me that I am able to work for myself and for others. It is the caring we want more than money.

The gift without the sympathy and interest of the giver is empty. If you care, if we can make the people of this great country care, the blind will indeed triumph over blindness.

The opportunity I bring to you, Lions, is this: To foster and sponsor the work of the American Foundation for the Blind. Will you not help me hasten the day when there shall be no preventable blindness; no little deaf, blind child untaught; no blind man or woman unaided?

I appeal to you Lions, you who have your sight, your hearing, you who are strong and brave and kind. Will you not constitute yourselves Knights of the Blind in this crusade against darkness?


