I. Online Payment Options

After logging onto MyLCI, choose <u>Club</u>, <u>Statement</u> and select <u>PayPal or Credit/Debit</u> Card.

II. Payments through your District Office

You may pay by cheque. Payment in Australian dollars covering amounts due on your account may be made at the exchange rate per U.S. dollar printed on the top portion of this statement.

Please mail your cheque made payable to Lions Clubs International along with the top portion of your club's monthly statement of account to your Cabinet Treasurer. Your Cabinet Treasurer will then deposit your cheque in the correct LCI Account and transmit your club's payment information to the International Association for processing.

Your Cabinet Treasurer will retain a copy of your payment for their records should you have questions and would need to contact them regarding your club's payment. Your payment will be converted and credited at the Lionistic exchange rate in effect the date of deposit. For this reason, it is important that payment of this statement be made promptly.




Tassie Dancers Against Cancer

LIFE MEMBERSHIP PRESENTATIONS


The Lions Club of Kings Meadows proudly awarded Life Membership status to 2 of its long-standing members.

Lion Eric joined Coolah Lions in September 1967, within two years of the formation of the Club.



Catering for Disabled Tourists....How well do we do??

The Lions Club of Luberon Maubec, near Marseilles (https://www.facebook.com/lionsluberonmaubec/) in southern France Is a sponsor of two young women (one of whom is quadriplegic) who are undertaking an extended journey over the next few months. Their journey, starting in late October, 2017 and continuing until late May, 2018 will see them touring Australia, New Zealand, New Caledonia and French Polynesia. It includes them visiting Tasmania from 4th to 14th March, 2018.

One objective of what these young women call their "Tetra Trip" is to evaluate how well hotels, visitor venues, airlines and other service/facility providers cater to the needs of disabled travellers. Nathalie, the quadriplegic young woman, has found that many venues and services that purport to cater for disabled people don't actually do so very well. Examples include: paths that are too steep for wheelchairs; steps; doors that are too narrow; unadapted bathrooms; inaccessible toilets; carpets that impede the passage of wheelchairs and many more.

Nathalie and Karen (Nathalie's able-bodied companion) will be blogging during their journey and, on completion, plan to publish a guide for disabled travellers, detailing the extent to which venues and services fall short of, meet or exceed their claims of catering for disabled people. The blog and guide have the potential to promote tourism.

I know that Tourism Tasmania has some information, Hobart City Council has at least one person with experience in this context, there is the http://wheeliegoodguide.com.au/ and there is http://paraquadtas.org.au/contact/. I have made initial contact with all these. Information about any other relevant organisations or services will be greatly appreciated.

By the time Nathalie and Karen get to Tasmania, in March, I would like to be able to present them with a suggested itinerary that includes detailed information relating to how well Tasmania caters for disabled tourists. In order to do this properly, I need your help. Will you, please, whilst going about your normal activities, try to observe what facilities are provided for disabled people (especially those confined to wheelchairs) and how well they do it? If you can email your findings to me: russell.p.cairns@bigpond.com, I will endeavour to collate the information for Nathalie and Karen. I would, also, appreciate hearing from any Clubs that would be willing to meet with and assist Nathalie and Karen during their visit.
