




Club News & Activities

Kindness Matters Service Award:

Lions Club of Kingborough was recently judged the winner of Kindness Matters Service Award, for 201T1, 2023.

Kingborough Lions club created a memorial garden for residents especially for those with dementia at Christian Homes Snug Village. A garden of yesteryear was created with circular pathways to accommodate wheel chairs and mobility walkers. Placed around the garden in between the sensory shrubbery were memory objects, which included a bright red post-box, roadside telephone box, a bus shelter with metro sign, a decorative windmill, a water feature, fernery, and covered gazebo. Along the paths are 3 bench seats so the visitors can sit, relax, and enjoy the gardens.

Numerous local business donated time, materials, and expertise, to create this garden. Kingborough's nomination has been submitted to Multiple District for judging on 15th October, and then the National winners, nomination is sent to LCI for International judging.

Leo Club King Island won the Leo section of Kindness Matters with their "Freedom To Feel Fantastic" project. It is a signature youth project promoted by the Australian Lions Wellness Foundation (ALWF). "Freedom" is a national body image and self esteem campaign designed to help young people feel good about the skin they're in. The project was organised by Leos, who ran activities at their local District High School on a nominated day, and endorsed by the teaching staff. Students were allowed to wear free dress and were invited to make a gold coin donation, which Leos forwarded to ALWF. The message of being kind to yourself was played out with students aiming water balloons at a SPLAT WALL, which was decorated with negative body image messages. Younger students made photo frames designed with positive messages to "reframe their thinking" Lions Club members prepared a sausage sizzle for the whole school. This is the second year Leos have run this activity which proved very popular with staff and students.

Congratulations to Lions Club Kingborough and Leo Club King Island for winning this award and I hope you both do well at Multiple District judging. I also sincerely thank the other nominations for their extremely worthwhile projects, which are also greatly helping others and making greatly enhancing the lives of others in our community.





"We became aware of a family in our area, Cathrin & Jason and their 2 boys needing community support. Ryder has


Leukodystrophy. An a incurable condition with a life expectancy between 6

- 3. Zoom 40% own ability, 40% explaining to others.

Key areas for District Chairs (% neutral or not confident in):

- 1. MyLion 50% own ability, 50% explaining to others.
- 2. Social media 40% own ability, 50% explaining to others.



3. Zoom 20% own ability, 50% explaining to others.

Key District Chair comments:

- Accurate list of duties expected.
- Dropbox procedures.
- Requirements, chiefly emanating from LCI and MD, are rapidly making it prohibitively expensive to be an active Lion.
- Need more How To guides.

Key areas for Region/Club Support (% neutral or not confident in):

- 1. MyLion 77% own ability, 88% explaining to others.
- 2. Dropbox 77% own ability, 77% explaining to others.
- 3. Lions Resources 66% own ability, 88% explaining to others.
- Zoom 55% own ability, 66% explaining to others.
- 5. Social media 44% own ability, 77% explaining to others.

What Does a Zone (Club Support) Chairperson Do?

According to the District Constitution, "The zone chairperson, subject to the supervision and direction of the district governor and/or region

chairperson, shall be the chief administrative officer in his/her zone. The Zone Chairperson is a member of the District Global Action Team.

" Essentially, they are the link between clubs and cabinet."

The main roles and responsibilities are:

Visit each club (one visit only to each club is required by LCI per year) as arranged with the clubs.

Keep in monthly contact with presidents and secretaries, sharing information where and when required.

Ensure all clubs are aware of leadership, service and membership opportunities in the district and multi-district.

Serve as the first port of call when conflict or problems arise in clubs.

Hold regular District Governor Advisory (Zone) meetings with club to report on activities and share ideas.

The Club Zone Chairperson is the eyes and ears of the District Governor and reports each visit to the DG team. It is really helpful if Club Support Chairs can identify future leaders in the club in their report.





Public Relations.

Contact was made with "WIN TV" regarding Television Advertisements and while the details are still being finalised it looks promising.

Further discussions are taking place this week and I will be able to make a presentation to District Cabinet on Sunday for consideration.

Sad so few Lions attended the Charter of the Online Club at the Great Lakes, it was a special day after so many years. How proud our new Lions family were, may it go from strength to strength in the coming years.

Extension.

Membership and Extension must be embraced as a project of every Lions Club.

Growth is continuing in the District but more needs to be done.

If a product is damaged during transit, contact Dollar Sweets. You will need to provide details of the extent and type of damage and the quantity and type of goods affected. Dollar Sweets will lodge a complaint with the freight company on behalf of the relevant Lions Club. Photographic evidence of damaged goods may be requested so it is advised to hold onto any damaged goods until you have spoken to Dollar Sweets.

Goods lost in transit will only be replaced once confirmation has been received from the courier that the order is unrecoverable. Once confirmation has been received, replacement goods will be sent on the next available dispatch day.

Dollar Sweets must be notified as soon as possible of any damaged or lost in transit goods. Credits claims may be rejected if too much time has lapsed.


