It was a great experience to hear how the Youth of the Year finalists approached their impromptu questions also the way they presented their prepared topics. This year's Youth of the Year is Gillian Maloney from Western Australia. The Leos finalists also did very well with our Tasmanian entrant Kara Barker winning the public speaking section.

Congratulations to the winners but remember there are no losers as all contestants gain from the experience. These are great competitions; let us continue to look after our youth into the future.

During Convention week the incoming Multiple District Council elected Peter Clarke, District Governor from N1 as our new Council Chairman. We have extended our congratulations to Peter and Denise.

At Agfest, the Premier made a presentation of \$31,173.60, being our pro-rata share of the \$250,000 promised for flood relief. Our thanks go to the communities who supported our Clubs in raising \$164,285.60 for the Queensland floods to the end of March. There has also been more money received by the Treasurer since the closing date. It has been a great effort by our Clubs donating \$205,622 to disasters through Treasurer Erik.

Some Clubs have done manual work and others have sent donations directly to districts affected.

We must also be aware that clubs have looked after their own communities as well.

Keep up the good work for the future of Lions and the well-being of our communities.

A CENTURY OF SERVICE


The two Lions pictured (below) have completed fifty (50) years of membership and service that can only be described as a rare and exceptional feat.

In reflecting on the countless projects, varied activities including fund raising, they have been involved in there is many parallels, despite starting their Lions journey in vastly two different locations, service to the various communities they have lived in over the many years, is the dominant stand out factor revealing individual dedication and tireless efforts to serve.

The game of cricket has many statistics and traditions, one is the raising of the bat on achieving a half century to the team, members and spectators or later on reaching the century receiving applause and a standing ovation for a fine innings.

Similarly, these two Lions have both achieved the half century and collectively a combined one hundred (100) years of membership, the bat can be well and truly raised in salute and recognition of this wonderful achievement which is rare given that

Lions in Australia dates to 1947. Coincidentally they are both currently members of the Lions Club of Sandy Bay (Tas).



The serving profile of **Lion Jack Lowe** (below right) presents a significant picture of commitment and service, he was a charter member of Windmill Hill Launceston club in 1961, where in 1964 became a Board member and was elected Vice-President in 1967 prior to transferring to the City of Hobart (Host) Club and was responsible in 1967 for the formation and charter of the Lions Club of Kingborough. Jack served as President in 1971-72 and again in 2004-2005, then transferred to Lions Club of Sandy Bay in 2005. He was awarded a Melvin Jones fellowship in 2008, and just to round off the fifty (50) years of membership, he has achieved 100% attendance which is a inspiration to all Lions.

Lion Kevin Cameron (*left*) began his adventure back in 1961 as a charter member of Mudgee (NSW) club, where he became treasurer and continued on the board, including serving as President during 1965. Due to a work transfer, he joined the Grafton club, serving on the board again, and then transferred to Hay and then Tumut. At Tumut Kevin served on the board as Vice-President and then as President in 1988 -1989. Then he went to Ashmore (Qld) club, again having a term as Vice-President and then President in1993-1994 and

then onto the Gold Coast Challenge club, serving as President in 2001-2002. He then transferred to Wagga Wagga South (NSW) in 2003-2008, serving on the board and then off to the Sandy Bay (Tas) club in 2009 and is currently on the board. In 1994-1995 he served as Zone Chairman and in 2002 received a James McLardie award for service to Lions and other community work.

This is a real story of continuity, activity and wonderful dedication to Lions over the years of members hip, with both wives and families in support while participating and being involved down the fifty (50) years. When the countless Lions man hours these two stalwarts have devoted to the community is taken into account, there is a clear message of:

This year our district T1 has had some success with Youth Exchange with four students arriving in Tasmania from over seas. Many thanks to Westbury, Ulverstone, Smithton/Circular Heads and Penguin Lions Clubs for supporting the Programme.

I have four students ready to arrive in July. Three of these will be hosted by the Lions Club of Penguin, they are from Europe and a Canadian who had as her choices Australia and Tasmania, and she will be hosted by Mersey Devonport. It is hoped that when she leaves Tasmania she will realize that we are part of Australia.

At present I am still looking for nearly forty host families, the high number at this stage is due to the Floods and Cyclone in parts of Australia, families that usually host are unable to do so because of the devastation in their areas. If you or your club is interested in hosting an overseas student, please contact me, and I will advise you as to what steps you need to take.

All students from Japan have been allocated families; we are looking for host families for students fro America, UK, Scandinavian and European Countries.

Helping Lions, Help Their Communities



During the MD Convention in Launceston the Chairman of the Foundation PDG Paul Logue had the pleasure of presenting the 5000th James D Richardson Award to Lion Colin Hingston from the Lions Club of Kings Meadows and on behalf of the Trustees I too, would like to congratulate Colin in receiving the Award.

Also at the Meeting of Trustees held prior to the Convention 19 grants totaling \$79,310.00 were approved, including a grant for \$6985.00 for the Lions Club of Kentish to assist the Club with the purchase of a "Maxi Patient Lifter Hoist" for the Tandara Lodge Community Care Centre at Sheffield.

In last months newsletter, I indicated that \$1,514,000 had been received by the Foundation from Clubs, Danish Disaster Fund and Public donations for the Emergency/ Disaster Fund and distributed \$1,400,000 to the affected Districts.

These funds are distributed through the District Governor in the disaster areas and in some instances by Clubs direct to families

As this newsletter goes to press the Foundation has received more donations from Clubs and DG Ken has just received the \$ for \$ donation from the State Government.

Further funds could be distributed following consultation with the Governors. Cabinet Treasurer Erik has forwarded almost \$150,000 to the Foundation from Club donations in T1. A magnificent effort by all Club in T1.

The Foundation has also distributed \$60,000 to the West Australian bush fires appeal and \$20,000 to the New Zealand earthquake appeal.

The Trustee from the C Districts recently attended the funerals of two long serving Lions in South Australia and it was the wish of both Lions and their families that in lieu of flowers for their burial that a donation be made to the Australian Lions Foundation. What a great idea!

The Foundation is now preparing stationery for these services.

The families involved both received letters of gratitude from the Foundation.

A highlight of a recent trip to North America by Lion Philip Viney, of the Ulverstone club, was the opportunity to visit to the Edmonton City Council chambers and present their Mayor Stephen Mandel with the limited edition Tasmanian Devil Island Project print, which was produced by Tasmanian Lions to raise funds and awareness of the plight of our iconic animal.

As a part of other official and unofficial meetings Philip (below left with the Mayor & Deputy Mayor) was granted audiences with the Mayor Stephen Mandel and Deputy Mayor Jane Batty of the City of Edmonton as well as the

Alberton Minister for Local Government, Hector Goudreau, where conversation included climate, geography, demographics, agriculture, tourism, sport flora and wildlife of both countries, as well as a common interest in the Edmonton Oilers NHL team.

Although both countries share a close heritage of British Settlement and the Westminster system, it still remains surprising as to the similarity of their political administrations, even though they are at

each end of the world.

Many of the issues that confront Australians are shared by those in Canada; with the only major difference being that we enjoy a much warmer climate in Tasmania – yes, Tasmania. Although Edmonton was approaching summer; snow remained unmelted and 15 centimetres of snow fell on the last day, with ice and snow covering the runway on the day of his departure.

Edmonton is the capital of Alberta province in Canada and is about 300 kilometres north of Calgary, just east of the Rocky Mountains on the Great Plains of North America and sits in the middle of the second largest oil field in the world.
