Morning Tea on intervening meeting weeks

An issue that has concerned me for some time is that some Lions Club members may only catch up with other members at dinner meetings, service activities and the occasional social function. Social interaction often becomes more infrequent as the average age of club members increases.

A proposal from Devonport Mersey First Vice President Tony Sutton for members, partners, and friends to attend morning tea (M/T) social gatherings on intervening meeting weeks, has been accepted by our club. Our first morning tea (M/T) was on the second Thursday of November 2023, followed by M/Ts on the fourth and fifth Thursday mornings.

We now have a daytime social interaction activity that can happen with minimal organisational involvement. Prospective new members can also come along and get to know members. Children's Vision Screening – Exeter Primary School

In mid August this year Lion Phil Crowden contacted the Exeter Primary School re the Children's Vision Screening Program. The staff at Exeter Primary were very enthusiastic to have this program in their school and wanted to give the opportunity to all students from Kindergarten to Grade 6. Rob Mantach met with the school's business manager and provided the school with the parent consent forms and brochures about the program. The school issued these to the 363 students.

The program culminated on November 28th when 118 students were tested for visual acuity, colour perception, depth perception and with the spot vision camera. It was recommended that 26 of the students should be referred to an optometrist for further examination, i.e. 22% of those screened.

This program is a great example of clubs helping each other as we had Lions members from 4 other clubs assisting with the screening. I want to thank Astrid Lewis and Brian Fitzgerald from the West Tamar Lions, Barb McQueen from Launceston Windmill Hill Lions, June Pearton from Kings Meadows Lions, Kay Farmer and Sue Mebbrey from George Town Lions as well as Bob Harkness and Wanda Mantach from the Riverside Lions Club. The team completed the screening by 2:30 PM.

The team received a number of congratulations from other Lions,

Lions Club of Penguin

Nov 17th saw the 4th annual International Men's Day breakfast at the Penguin Sports and Services Club. With 72 guests and a number of Lions attending, the chef was kept busy cooking eggs, bacon, sausages, hash browns baked beans and lots of toast, served up by Penguin Lions members. Suitably fed, those present settled back to be entertained by 2 guest speakers, a "stand-up comedian" followed by Greg Smith, part of the "Men Care Too" organisation, a local, not for profit group of men meeting regularly sharing news and information mainly aimed at men in unpaid informal caring roles.

Following the guest speakers, the inaugural "Kevin Townsend Quiet Achiever Award" was presented. The award was created in honour of the late Lion Kevin Townsend who imitated the 1st IMD in Penguin. The award was presented by Lion Kevin's wife, Lion Kathy and their family to Mr Dudley Corbett, a worthy recipient.

At our November dinner meeting, Penguin Lions had the pleasure of listening to LT CMD Kelly Wilson as she spoke of her life experiences in the Royal Australian Navy as a Combat Systems Operator and a Maritime Logistics Officer. Kelly was deployed 3 times to the Middle East, performed border protection operations and peace keeping missions.

Kelly is a mental health advocate and through her "Choose to live, Love Your Life" actively fundraises and speaks in the community about her own personal issues.

Friday Dec 1st saw the 1st Christmas Parade for the Coast with the well-attended, popular "Penguin Lions Club Christmas Parade". The estimated 4000 people attending were entertained with many local market stalls, food vans, including the Lions Club van and children's rides. There were an estimated 49 floats, many with local children participating and of course the necessary visit from the Man in Red who distributed packets of sweets to the younger members of the community present. Carols by Candlelight Sunday evening was well attended, loads of local talent, Santa visited again and was well received by the children, food, ice creams, coffee and a beautiful sunset to finish off the evening.





As 2023 swiftly draws to a close, we find ourselves on the brink of a new year, 2024. This past year has been a whirlwind, and as we enter the final stretch, we're proud of our progress. Thanks to our expanded team and innovative methods, we're on target to place a total of 35 Assistance Dogs by December's end. This includes 31 Hearing Assistance Dogs and 4 Medical Alert Dogs, showcasing the remarkable growth of our Medical Alert Program since its inception in 2021. By the end of 2023, we will have also accredited a total of 15 dogs. Our Puppy Program and Breeding Program have flourished, with various strategies enhancing their success. With this growth, the need for both puppies and volunteers to guide them during this crucial phase has risen. To meet this demand, our team has explored and tested new approaches, such as recruiting volunteers in the South-East of SA. These volunteers care for some of our puppies with fortnightly video calls and monthly visits from our Puppy Socialisation team. Presently, 5 puppies are in the South East being a part of this trial. Our volunteer program is thriving, with familiar and new faces dedicating their time to enriching the lives of our dogs. Their support ensures our dogs receive the love and care essential for their happiness and well-being.

Our heartfelt gratitude extends to the incredible sponsors from Lions Clubs and individual supporters who have played an invaluable role in our journey. After all, it is your support that has also been instrumental in our organisation's achievements.

As we bid adieu to spring and embrace the upcoming summer, along with the festive season of Christmas and New Year's, please note that our Training Centre will be closed during the holidays. However, our dedicated staff will be on-site, ensuring our dogs are well cared for. Our office will close from the end of business on Friday, December 22nd, reopening on Tuesday, January 2nd. During this period, our emergency phone line will remain active for urgent matters that require immediate attention. We want to express our heartfelt gratitude for your unwavering support and interest in ALHD throughout 2023. Wishing you all a joyful and safe holiday season and we can't wait to see you in 2024.

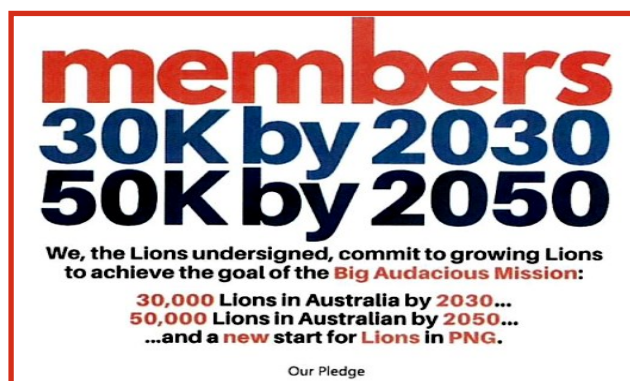

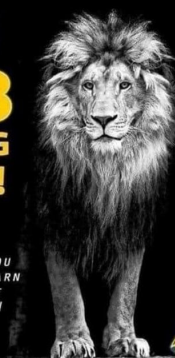

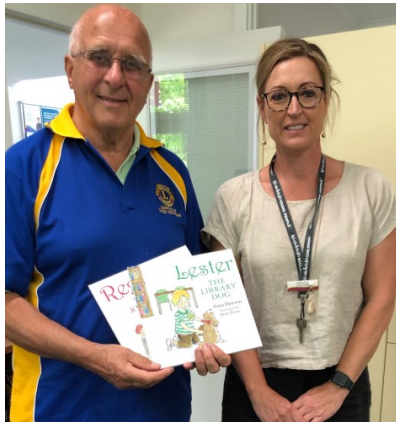

What Does the Cabinet Treasurer Role Entail?

According to the Lions Clubs International District 201T1Inc

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS, the Cabinet Treasurer must:

- (1) Make reports to the cabinet as the district governor or cabinet may require.
- (2) Collect and receipt for all dues and taxes levied on members and clubs in the sub-district, deposit the same in such bank or banks as the district governor shall determine and disburse the same by order of the district governor.
- (3) Remit and pay over to the multiple district council treasurer the multiple district dues and taxes, if any, collected in the sub-district, and secure a proper receipt.
- (4) Keep accurate books and records of account, and minutes of all cabinet and sub-district meetings, and permit inspection of the same by the district governor, any cabinet member and any club (or any authorized agent of any of them) at any reasonable time for any proper purpose. Upon direction of the district governor or the cabinet, he/she shall furnish any such books and records as requested to any auditor appointed by the district governor.
- (5) Secure bond for the faithful performance of his/her duties in such sum and with such sureties as may be required by the district governor.
- (6) Deliver, in a timely manner, at the conclusion of his/her term in office, the general and/or financial accounts, funds and records of the district to his/her successor in office.
- (7) Perform such other functions and acts as may be required of each by directives of the International Board of Directors.

This campaign is going to begin with a Media Release which will direct any interested public to a specific Website - made up of 3 pages. Page 1 will be a Landing Page; Page 2 – Membership Page, and Page 3 – Donation Page.

Membership enquiries will be directed to a District representative within 48hrs. The potential member will be interviewed and the best Club option will be discussed, taking into account what they're interested in supporting. The appropriate Clubs' membership Chair and President will be notified, and Clubs are requested to make contact with that potential member within 48hrs.

If you're lucky enough to receive a new member out of this process, please LISTEN to them, HEAR what they want in Lions, SPONSOR them through their early membership days, and ACTIVELY sort out your members so that CONFLICT is minimised both within the club and especially in the public eye. Most new members nowadays are well educated, have their own views, do not want to be micro-managed, have certain interests, and will not put up with Club CONFLICT.

Historically, many recruits in the past have resigned from Lions within around 2 years – for a variety of reasons. While conflict has been the cause in some cases, in many cases, it's because Clubs have not been willing to listen to their members.

Please take the time to understand your new members needs and strongly support them.

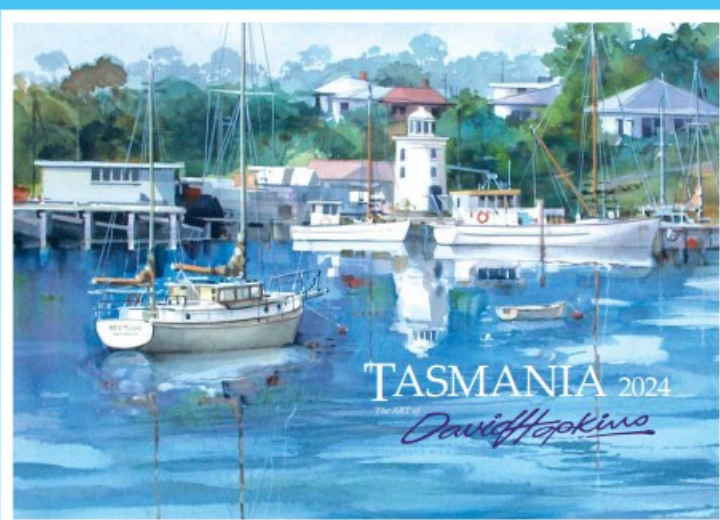

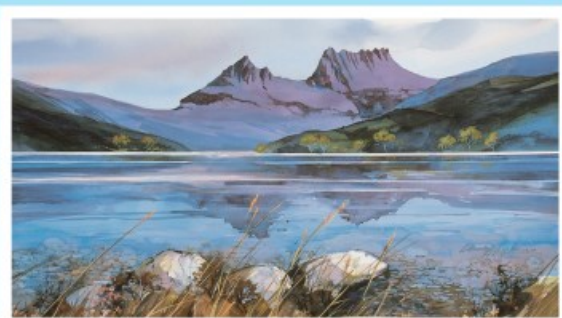
