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### District Governor's Notes

As this is my last newsletter contribution as your District Governor, I would like to reflect somewhat on the past year.

In the process of appointing my Cabinet in early 2009, I asked each to respond to a number of questions. One was to indicate what they hoped to achieve in their respective District roles in the coming year. With respect to my expectations in leading the District, I indicated in the July 2009 newsletter that, membership was of prime importance for the District.

As indicated last month, the minimum target of 1250 members was passed and I can report that a further nett increase has been achieved in May. From the low point of 1227 at the end of July 2009, the current achievement of 1276 is to be commended. I congratulate all Clubs in their efforts to help bring the District out of 'transition' which I expect to be achieved on 1 July this year.

An early consideration of Cabinet was the development of a Membership/Public Relations unit for use by Clubs throughout the District. Thanks to the efforts of a number of dedicated Lions, this was achieved and put on the road in May. It is now up to Clubs to make use of the unit. (See article April 2010 edition of this newsletter/page 1 and June-July 2010 Lion magazine/page 7 - Editor)

As a consequence of the Haiti earthquake, the Clubs of the District rallied in support of the LCIF Appeal for Haiti to the extent of over \$23,000 which was matched by a Tasmanian Government grant to the Appeal. This again shows the generosity of Tasmanian in times of disaster.

Congratulation to all contributors,

your efforts will be appreciated.

It is also pleasing to report that the Clubs of the District, be they large or small, have made considerable contributions in their respective communities. A notable success at a District level, but more so at a Club level, was the achievement of 'our' National Youth of the Year winner, William Teare, sponsored by the City of Launceston Lions Club.

With the assistance of a great Cabinet team, I believe that the Clubs of the District, and therefore the District as a whole, have each achieved their respective goals for the year. I am very much appreciative of the way in which Cabinet has worked to assist Clubs to undertake service to their communities and to help manage the affairs of the District.

I wish Ken Gatehouse and his Cabinet team every success in the coming year.

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


All we need now is for you, the Lions of Tasmania to get behind our hard working team and support a weekend of fun and fellowship, we have it, come and sample it.

- **Supporting Disaster Relief at Convention**

At convention in Sydney, Australia, a number of activities will commemorate the devastating earthquake that struck the island nation of Haiti in January. A full-size tent, like those being used in Lions' tent cities in Haiti, will be showcased in the exhibit hall by the LCIF booth. An exhibit with photos highlighting Lions' response to the Haiti earthquake will also be on display. Lions will have the opportunity to learn about relief efforts, see first-hand the tents we are providing and make a contribution to further support disaster relief efforts. In addition, Haitian Lions will speak at the LCIF plenary session, providing a first-hand account. Lions will also have the opportunity to support other recent disasters, like the Chile and China earthquakes.

## FROM OUR INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT



Greetings.

As we approach the final weeks of 2009-10, I'm again very pleased to report that Lions all over the world have indeed "**Moved to Grow!**" Our net membership growth through May has reached plus 33,817. This compares to a net positive growth of 23,729 for the same period last year - making for an unprecedented 42% improvement.

**This is by far the best net membership growth through May that our association has experienced in decades. My congratulations to all of you who have helped produce these remarkable, historic results.**

While not every one of LCI's seven constitutional areas are positive (two - USA and Canada -- are slightly down), all areas have improved significantly over historic trends. Our total worldwide membership now stands at 1,352,136. And we are now on track to realize the best membership growth in LCI's modern history if we can keep up the momentum through June.

We know that June is when some clubs drop members more than in other months. Before you drop a member who has not been active lately, please reach out to them and let them know you care. Ask them to consider coming back and let them know their presence is missed. I know that all us as human beings really appreciate it when someone calls to say they miss us. You may be surprised by the number of positive responses you get.

In the meantime, as we work toward the most successful membership growth year in Lions history, let me share two more special success stories.

### New Country

I am proud to report the LCI will soon be adding its **206<sup>th</sup> country** and geographic territory to our international family. The Kingdom of Bhutan, nestled between India and China, will join our ranks this month. The country's home minister will be joining me on stage in Sydney to celebrate this historic event.

### Women at Lions

The number of women members continues to surge ahead this year. We have a net gain of +23,233 women members this year, bringing the grand total of women members to 298,592. I sincerely hope we

can cross the 300,000 mark by the end of the June.

I am convinced that the continued success of our association - and its growth - will be based on the **dual strategy** of forming new clubs and bringing in new members on the one side, and working to grow the size of existing clubs to control long-term retention. Our 51 new ginkgo winners (listed right) have proven it can be done.

And to help us move even faster into the future, I am also pleased to report that the Joint Board Committee working on a plan and concept for restructuring MERL is nearing completion. The new plan, which will be reviewed at the upcoming Sydney board meeting, will result in the Global Membership Team being expanded down to the district level; in "retention" being refashioned into a "club success" function complete with new tools such as the Club Excellence Process; and with leadership being elevated to its own platform under a new structure and team to be called the Global Leadership Team. This is just one more example of how we have worked on many levels to **Move to Grow** our great association.

**The continent of Africa will also be helping us move to an even brighter future. I traveled there last week with our executive director to discuss the LCI board's recent decision to treat Africa as its own distinct area similar to a constitutional area. They are now working to Move to Grow like never before, and they wanted me to relay their sincere thanks and gratitude to all of you.**

*So my fellow Lions, let's all do what we can in these final weeks to bring our association to heights it has never reached before. And thank you again, from the bottom of my heart, for all you have done to make this a truly remarkable year.*

# Young drivers learn road safety lessons in and out of the car Students driven to learn

**GREAT initiatives can come from unfortunate events when key people in a community decide to do something about a situation.**

This was the case three years ago.

After a young person was involved in a car accident, the Latrobe Lions Club initiated discussion with a couple of organizations to gauge interest in supporting driver education awareness among young drivers.

The program aims to make young people aware of the dangers of driving and their obligations to other drivers while also making them aware of the need to maintain their vehicles in a proper manner.

**From the discussions a partnership was forged between the Lions Club, Latrobe High School and the Latrobe Speedway and a five-week driver awareness program developed.**

"The first week of the program covers road rule theory as well as walking the streets of Latrobe to look at road signage and line markings and discussing what they mean," coordinator Chelsea Gale said.

"In week two we invite a guest speaker along, generally a police officer or paramedic, who talks of their experience and perspective of road incidents."

The students also do some practical activities with a qualified instructor at the Latrobe Speedway.

"Students experience driving on a sealed

pit area at the speedway," Mrs Gale said. "Often, this is a student's first time behind the wheel, in control of a vehicle and it remains to be a positive lasting experience.

"The last week of the course, and a new element added last year and further expanding the partnership, involves an excursion to a mechanic's workshop.

"We are very fortunate to have Motors and Gowans Toyota come on board and support us in this aspect as it involves meeting with a mechanic who goes through the benefits of regular servicing of a vehicle; what to look for when buying a second hand car; the effects of clean and dirty oil; how to pump up and even change a tyre; identifying the safety features of the car; and basically knowledge of how to keep a car in a good condition."

# FIRE DESTROYS LIONS CONTAINER

As if two fires were not enough, a third accidental blaze at Peter Whittaker's property has destroyed the storage container of the Lions Club of Spring Bay. The majority of the Lions Club property was stored in the container with only the fish fryers and gas bottles away as the Club members were in Swansea assisting with the France to Freycinet Festival.

Fire engulfed the container on Sunday May 27<sup>th</sup> around lunch time and appeared to be caused by an open fire used by builders to get rid of rubbish following the reconstruction of the Whittaker's house after fire damaged the property in February. Somehow the fire had not extinguished and smoldered its way into the back and under the container over 24 hours with the covered area where timber poles, chairs and sheep bags were stored.

By the time the local fire brigade had arrived, the fire was so fierce it was impossible to prevent total destruction of all the interior goods stored.

Lost were two (2) new tents recently constructed by Chris from East Coast Canvas as well as three (3) others, two (2) almost new BBQ's, four (4) new trestle tables, an urn, an electric fryer, at least five (5) heavy duty extension leads and power boards, several Eskis,



many sundry items such as cups, serviettes etc, in boxes, the Lions Chocolate Wheel, set of images for Australia Day, the flagpole and flags, various signs and bill-boards – virtually all the equipment the Club had built up over the past sixteen (16) years.

Unfortunately none of the goods were covered by insurance because of various technical reasons, so the Club is now faced with having to try to rebuild its supplies before the fundraising season commences again in Spring.

Club members are devastated by this disaster and being a service group, now fully understand the hardship people go through when such events occur. The problem is that they are usually the ones offering support.

It just goes to show you can't be too careful when it comes to fire, even when the weather is cool and damp.



## **Australian Lions Foundation** **Helping Lions, Help Their Communities**

Five (5) Tasmanian Clubs have recently benefited from Grants approved at our last Meetings, namely:

- **Lions Club of Clarence** received \$9000 to assist with the purchase a second hand Wheel Chair Access Vehicle for a family with two disabled children.
- **Lions Club of Tasman** received \$800 to purchase "Care alert units" for elderly residents in the Tasman area.
- **Lions Clubs of St Helens and St Marys** (a joint project) received \$7500 to assist the their Communities in fundraising efforts to purchase a "Special Wheelchair" for a quadriplegic adult.
- **Lions Club of Glamorgan** received a grant of \$3000 to assist the Club purchase a Defibrillator and Hands Free UHF Radios for the local volunteer Fire Brigade.
